PRESENTATIONS

1. Youth Build

Presenter: Rossie Johnson

Rossie Johnson, Executive Director of Antelope Valley YouthBuild gave a presentation on the program and its accomplishments. The program has been in place since 2007; it consists of youths between the ages of 16 and 24; currently has 140 students. It is currently the only program in the State of California that is allowed students over the age of 19 in a high school classroom based setting. It is considered a leadership development program which offers unique learning opportunities needed to maintain employment once they have graduated.

They have received grants from Department of Labor to assist with funding of the program. They also focus on community service which teaches additional labor skills to the students and community awareness. He invited the commission to come and speak with the students. The graduation rate is one of the highest in Southern California.

2. Demographic and Statistical Report on Mariposa Neighborhood Presenter: Brenda Gamlowski/Lee D'Errico

Brenda Gamlowski presented the census track demographic information for Mariposa and Desert View area which will assist the commission as they move forward regarding the UNITE Program. She discussed the need for services within the area.

Lee D'Errico gave a presentation on the crime statistics in the neighborhood . He stated that the Los Angeles County Sheriff's department has already began working in the area and the City will piggyback with them by bringing in the UNITE Program to assist with the clean-up of the area.

Surveys have been conducted within the area to determine what services are needed to assist in maintaining the neighborhood.

3. Asthmapolis Update

Presenter: Patricia Garibay/Kelvin Tainatongo

Patti Garibay gave a brief update on Asthmapolis. She stated their first step will be to host informational meetings inviting the medical community to assist with the program. Next, would be the creation of an advisory committee to develop program details. Once that is complete, we will be ready to launch program using press conference and website/social media to market it. This should show how the device works and how residents can participate. Ms. Garibay explained the premise of the program would be to place a device in the inhaler and track when and where the inhaler was used.
