RECOMMENDATION: Approve Resolution No. 13-18 revoking Conditional Use Permit

No. 11-10

PROCEDURAL HISTORY:

■ August 8, 2011:

Application for a conditional use permit for a concert venue/nightclub with on-site alcohol sales (beer and wine,) and a waiver for the normal distance requirements pursuant to Section 17.42.040(C) of the Lancaster Municipal Code, was filed with the Planning Department.

■ November 21, 2011: The Planning Commission adopted Resolution No. 11-18 approving Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10, which allows for the on-site sale of beer and wine under a Type 42 State Alcoholic Beverage Control ("ABC") license, and which approves the waiver of the normal distance requirements.

December 1, 2011:

The applicant, Mr. Tully Huffaker ("applicant" or "Mr. Huffaker"), signed "Affidavit of Acceptance of Conditions" for Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10, and returned the document to the Planning Department, thereby stating his acceptance of and agreement to comply with the conditions of approval established under Resolution No. 11-18.

■ December 1, 2011: The City of Lancaster issued a business license for the Industry Theater;

the description of the business is identified as "concert venue."

■ January 31, 2012: The City issued a letter to Mr. Huffaker, granting request to change the

ABC license from Type 42 to Type 40, which authorizes only the sale of beer and prohibits wine or distilled spirits on the premises, and which

allows minors to be on the premises.

CASE BACKGROUND

CUP Conditions

On December 1, 2011, applicant Tully Huffaker signed an Affidavit of Acceptance of Conditions for Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10. The conditions he agreed to, in pertinent part, include the following:

- Condition No. 2 Per the direction of the Planning Director, the applicant shall comply with applicable provisions of Chapter 17.42 of the Lancaster Municipal Code.
- Condition No. 3 Hours of operation for the concert venue and private events over 50 persons would be 7:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday, and between 5:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. on weekdays, with the exception of Wednesdays and Sundays. No events shall take place on Wednesdays or Sundays.
- Condition No. 6 The applicant agreed to only sell beer and wine (ABC Type 42, on-sale beer and wine for public premises) and not to request an upgrade to full general liquor license. Any upgrade to the liquor license would require a new application for a conditional use permit.
- Condition No. 9 All alcoholic beverages shall be sold, served, and consumed in a 682 square-foot lounge that is separated from the concert/venue area, and no one under twenty-one years of age will be allowed into that area. Project authorization shall be for the serving and dispensing of beer and wine for on-site consumption in the lounge. The consumption of beer and wine, as well as the presence of open containers, shall be permitted only in this location. Alcoholic beverages shall not be permitted in any portion of the establishment beyond the lounge.
- Condition No. 9 Alcoholic beverages shall not be permitted to be consumed in the parking area or other exterior areas of the premises.

Condition No. 25 A strict "No in-and-out" policy shall be enforced, which would restrict guests from entering and exiting the premises [repeatedly].

Condition No. 29 Security personnel shall not be armed at any time.

The following is a summary of incidents/conditions at or concerning the Industry Theater that form the basis for this revocation hearing:

Shooting Incident

On February 23, 2013 at approximately 2:00 a.m., deputies with the County of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department ("LASD") Lancaster station responded to a call for service at the Industry Theater (hereafter, "the club") concerning an assault with a deadly weapon. On an undeveloped lot adjacent to the club, they found a man who had been shot. While LASD officers began their investigation into the shooting, other LASD deputies who were at Antelope Valley Hospital on an unrelated matter noted that several people with gunshot wounds were arriving. It was later determined that these people were injured at the club. In all, four people were shot, one was beaten, and the window of a patron's vehicle was shot out.

(Declaration of LASD Detective Daniel Welle ("Welle Decl."), ¶3; see also true and correct copies of the LASD Incident Report and Supplemental Reports, collectively attached as Exhibit "F")

The LASD investigation into the shooting, which included interviews with applicant Tully Huffaker and club patrons, revealed that a rap concert had ended shortly before the shooting. As patrons were leaving the club, several fights broke out inside the club. Security officers used pepper spray on some of the fighting patrons. A man inside the club was observed holding a handgun. Some men ran out of the club and got inside two cars, then drove past the front door of the club and began shooting towards the club. A security officer inside the club who was armed with a semi-automatic handgun fired shots through the front of the club. One car then went around the building and fired shots at the rear of the club.

(Exhibit F, generally; see esp. F-23, F-29 and F-30)

Two bar counters were set up in the lounge area, with shelves behind the counters. Numerous bottles of distilled spirits and liquor were on the shelves. Liquor bottles were also observed elsewhere in the club, outside the lounge area.

(Welle Decl., ¶4)

Investigating deputies found a flyer on the premises, advertising the event of February 22, 2013; it showed the event ending at 2:00 a.m. on February 23. (Exhibit F-33)

City Inspection

On August 20, 2013, City Public Safety personnel and LASD deputies conducted an inspection of the club to ascertain compliance with ABC rules. Applicant Tully Huffaker was asked to make available for inspection records establishing that all club employees who serve or sell alcoholic

beverages had successfully completed responsible beverage service training. He stated that he did not have such records. He stated that he allowed concert promoters renting the club to use his ABC license. He was asked but failed to produce records to verify the lawful purchase of alcoholic beverages for retail sale.

(Declaration of LASD Deputy Lance Jordan ("Jordan Decl."), ¶¶8, 10, 11)

Mr. Huffaker acknowledged his intent to have an all-night rave party at which patrons would pay at the door and "camp" in the club overnight.

(Jordan Decl. ¶7)

A bag of marijuana was observed during the inspection of Mr. Huffaker's office; he acknowledged that it was his and that he did not have any medical conditions. He was issued a citation for possession of a controlled substance.

(Jordan Decl., ¶9)

Public Safety personnel subsequently searched the internet for photos taken at the club in 2013, and found photos depicting the presence of alcoholic beverages outside of the lounge area inside the club and patrons in exterior portions of the premises with alcohol containers. A search of the Industry Theater's Facebook page revealed postings advertising concerts and other events with hours earlier and/or later than the permissible hours of operation and on impermissible days. One posting advertising a concert indicated that the club has a "smoking patio."

(Declaration of Lancaster Public Safety Officer Anthony Perez ("Perez Decl."), ¶¶4-13; see also true and correct of screen prints collectively attached as Exhibit "G")

Other Calls for Service (LASD)

In addition to the shooting incident discussed above, there have been seven other incidents at the club that resulted in calls for service to LASD between October 2012 and August 2013; most occurred after the shooting incident. These included fights and arguments in the parking lot, and a false report of bombs having been planted in the club.

(Jordan Decl., ¶12; see also true and correct copy of LASD Calls for Service Log attached as "Exhibit "H")

GROUNDS FOR REVOCATION

Authority of Planning Commission to Revoke

Lancaster Municipal Code §17.42.130.C authorizes the Planning Commission to set a public hearing to consider revocation of a conditional use permit for noncompliance with the performance standards set forth in LMC §17.42.110, which provides that a conditional use permit shall be subject to revocation if any of the following is found to exist:

(A) Activities within the premises or in close proximity of the premises which constitute a nuisance under any section of this code.

- (B) Where the operation of the premises is in violation of any applicable city ordinance or state or federal regulation or statute.
- (C) Failure to comply with any condition imposed in the issuance of a conditional use permit.

Violations

The events summarized above give rise to numerous violations of the conditions of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10 ("CUP"), the Lancaster Municipal Code ("LMC") and the California Business & Professions Code, including but not limited to the following:

- 1. Alcoholic beverages other than beer on the premises, in violation of CUP Condition Nos. 6 and 9 and Cal. Business & Professions Code §25607(a). (Welle Decl. ¶4; Exhibit I-2.)
 - This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(B) and (C).
- 2. Alcoholic beverages in areas of the club outside of the 682 square-foot lounge, in violation of CUP Condition No. 9. (Welle Decl. ¶4; Perez Decl. ¶5; Exhibit G-1.)
 - This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(C).
- 3. Alcoholic beverages consumed in exterior areas of the premises, in violation of CUP Condition No. 11. (Perez Decl. ¶¶6, 7; Exhibits G-2 and G-3)
 - This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(C).
- 4. Armed security personnel, in violation of CUP Condition No. 29. (Exhibit F, generally; F-23 and F-29 and F-30.)
 - This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(C).
- 5. Concerts or other events which continued past 1:00 a.m., in violation of CUP Condition No. 3. (Exhibit F-33; Perez Decl. ¶10; Exhibit G-6.)
 - This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(C).
- 6. A concert or other event which began before 7:00 p.m. on a Saturday, in violation of CUP Condition No. 3. (Perez Decl. ¶9; Exhibit G-5.)
 - This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(C).
- 7. Concerts or other events which were held on a Wednesday, in violation of CUP Condition No. 3. (Perez Decl. ¶¶12, 13; Exhibits G-7 and G-8)
 - This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(C).

A concert or other event which was held on a Sunday, in violation of CUP Condition No. 3. (Perez Decl. ¶13; Exhibit G-8)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(C).

9. Failure to make available for inspection records establishing that all club employees who serve or sell alcoholic beverages had successfully completed responsible beverage service training, in violation of LMC §17.42.070(G) and CUP Condition No. 2. (Jordan Decl. ¶11)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(B) and (C).

10. The use of an ABC license by persons other than licensee, in violation of California Business & Professions Code §23355. (Jordan Decl. ¶10; Exhibit I-1)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(B).

11. Failure to enforce a strict "No in-and-out" policy, which would restrict patrons from entering and exiting the club repeatedly, in violation of CUP Condition No. 25. (Perez Decl. ¶6, 7, 10; Exhibits G-2, G-3 and G-6)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(C).

12. Maintaining or allowing the maintenance of a "chronic nuisance" property (i.e., property that has generated five or more nuisance service calls during a twelve month period), in violation of LMC §8.52.040. (Jordan Decl. ¶12; Exhibit H)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to LMC §17.42.110(A) and (B).

The declarations and exhibits offered in support of staff's recommendation for revocation of CUP No. 11-10 clearly demonstrate numerous and serious violations of the operating conditions imposed under the CUP to which the applicant agreed and accepted, as well as violations of the municipal code and state law. These violations provide ample grounds for revocation. The applicant has shown a flagrant and continuing disregard for the health, safety and welfare of his patrons, adjacent property occupants, and the public at large. Staff believes revocation is clearly justified in this instance, and recommends that the Commission approve and adopt Resolution No. 13-18 to revoke Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10.

RESOLUTION NO. 13-18

A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LANCASTER, CALIFORNIA, REVOKING APPROVED CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. 11-10

WHEREAS, November 21, 2011, the Planning Commission approved and adopted Resolution No. 11-18 approving Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10 in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 17.32 and 17.42 of the Lancaster Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, approved Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10 permits the operation of a concert venue/nightclub with on-site sale of beer and wine; and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2012, the City granted applicant's request to change the California Department of Alcohol and Beverage Control ("ABC") license from Type 42 to Type 40, which authorizes only the sale of beer and prohibits wine or distilled spirits on the premises, and which allows minors to be on the premises; and

WHEREAS, Section 17.42.110 of the Lancaster Municipal Code establishes performance standards for alcohol establishments; and

WHEREAS, Section 17.42.130.C of the Lancaster Municipal Code authorizes the Planning Commission to set a public hearing to consider revocation of a conditional use permit for an alcoholic beverage establishment for noncompliance with said performance standards contained in said Section 17.42.110; and

WHEREAS, notice of intention to hold a public hearing to consider the revocation of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10 was given as required in Chapter 17.36 and Section 17.32.920 of the Lancaster Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, staff has performed necessary investigations, prepared a written report, and recommended revocation of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10 based upon the available evidence; and

WHEREAS, public notice was provided as required by law and a public hearing was held on November 18, 2013; and

WHEREAS, this Commission hereby adopts the following findings in support of the revocation of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10, based upon the referenced Declarations and Exhibits attached hereto and incorporated herein as part of this Resolution No. 13-18:

- 1. The applicant requested, received approval for, and acknowledged and accepted that Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10 allows the operation of a concert venue/nightclub with sale of alcohol subject to the conditions of approval. (Exhibits A, B and C.)
- 2. The applicant is in violation of Condition Nos. 6 and 9 of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10 and Section 25607(a) of the California Business & Professions Code, because

alcohol other than beer (i.e., liquor and distilled spirits) were present on the premises. (Declaration of Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department ("LASD") Detective Daniel Welle, ¶4; Exhibit I-2.)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to Section 17.42.110(B) and (C) of the Lancaster Municipal Code.

3. The applicant is in violation of Condition No. 9 of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10, because alcoholic beverages were present in areas of the club outside of the 682 square-foot lounge. (Welle Declaration. ¶4; Declaration of Lancaster Public Safety Officer Anthony Perez ¶5; Exhibit G-1.)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to Section 17.42.110 (C) of the Lancaster Municipal Code.

4. The applicant is in violation of Condition No. 11 of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10, because alcoholic beverages were consumed in exterior areas of the premises. (Perez Declaration ¶¶6, 7; Exhibits G-2 and G-3.)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to Section 17.42.110(B) and (C) of the Lancaster Municipal Code.

5. The applicant is in violation of Condition No. 29 of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10, because security personnel at the concert venue/nightclub were armed. (Exhibit F, generally; F-23, F-29 and F-30.)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to Section 17.42.110(C) of the Lancaster Municipal Code.

6. The applicant is in violation of Condition No. 3 of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10, because the concert venue/nightclub continued operating after 1:00 a.m., began operating on Saturday before 7:00 p.m., and operated on Wednesday and Sunday. (Exhibit F-33; Perez Declaration ¶¶9, 10, 12, 13; Exhibits G-5 – G-8.)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to Section 17.42.110(C) of the Lancaster Municipal Code.

7. The applicant is in violation of Condition No. 1 of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10 and of Section 17.42.070(G) of the Lancaster Municipal Code, because he failed to make available for inspection records establishing that all concert venue/nightclub employees who serve or sell alcoholic beverages had successfully completed responsible beverage service training. (Declaration of LASD Deputy Lance Jordan ¶11.)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to Section 17.42.110(B) and (C) of the Lancaster Municipal Code.

8. The applicant has allowed other persons to use his ABC license, in violation of Section 23355 of the California Business & Professions Code. (Jordan Declaration ¶10; Exhibit I-1.)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to Section 17.42.110(B) of the Lancaster Municipal Code.

9. The applicant has failed to enforce a strict "No in-and-out" policy, which would restrict patrons from entering and exiting the club repeatedly, in violation of CUP Condition No. 25. (Perez Decl. ¶6, 7, 10; Exhibits G-2, G-3 and G-6)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to Section 17.42.110(C) of the Lancaster Municipal Code.

10. The applicant has maintained or permitted the maintenance of a "chronic nuisance" property which has generated five or more nuisance service calls during a twelve month period, in violation of Section 8.52.040 of the Lancaster Municipal Code. (Jordan Declaration ¶12; Exhibit H.)

This constitutes grounds for revocation pursuant to Section 17.42.110(A) and (B) of the Lancaster Municipal Code.

- 11. The staff report and the supporting Declarations and Exhibits establish the operation of the concert venue/nightclub in a manner that constitutes significant violations of the Lancaster Municipal Code and the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control regulations and that warrants revocation of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10.
- 12. The use for which the approval was granted is so exercised as to be detrimental to the public health or safety, or so as to be a nuisance.

Declaration of LASD Detective Daniel Welle, dated October 31, 2013

DECLARATION OF DANIEL WELLE

I, Daniel Welle, declare and state as follows:

- 1. I am over the age of eighteen and am not a party to this action. Except as otherwise indicated, the facts set forth herein are known to me personally, or have been determined by my review of official City records. If called upon as a witness, I could and would competently testify thereto.
- 2. I am now, and at all times mentioned herein have been, a detective with the County of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department ("LASD" or "Department"), assigned to the Operation Safe Streets Bureau at the Lancaster station. I have been employed by LASD for fourteen years.
- 3. This declaration concerns the Industry Theater, located at 43415 business Center Parkway #103, in the city of Lancaster. At approximately 3:30 a.m. on February 23, 2013, I was called to the location to participate in the Department's investigation of a multiple shooting at the nightclub/concert venue. (True and correct copies of the LASD Incident Report and Supplemental Reports concerning this incident are attached collectively as Exhibit F.)
- 4. As I conducted a walk-through of the club, I observed a room to the right of the entry, which appeared to be set up like a bar/lounge. I observed two bar counters in this room, each with shelves behind the counter. Primarily I noticed cans/bottles which contained beverages such as juice, water and malt liquor/energy drink combinations (I.E. 'Four Loko'). However; mixed in with these I also observed bottles which contained, to the best of my memory, gin, vodka and whiskey. Elsewhere within the club there were, what appeared to be, V.I.P. or performer dressing/waiting rooms which also contained a few bottles of alcohol. Throughout the premises I saw small ziplock type baggies discarded on the floor. These commonly used in my

1	experience to contain 'Party Drugs' such as marijuana, ecstasy, cocaine and
2	methamphetamine. There was a heavy odor of burnt Marijuana throughout the
3	building.

DECLARATION OF LANCE JORDAN

I, Lance Jordan, declare and state as follows:

- 1. I am over the age of eighteen and am not a party to this action. Except as otherwise indicated, the facts set forth herein are known to me personally, or have been determined by my review of official City records. If called upon as a witness, I could and would competently testify thereto.
- 2. I am now, and at all times mentioned herein have been, a deputy with the County of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department ("LASD" or "Department"). I have been employed by LASD for fifteen years, and have been assigned to the Lancaster station for twelve years.
- 3. I have had sixteen hours of training with California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control ("ABC") and Ontario Police Department training officers, in the inspection and investigation of ABC-licensed establishments. I am readily familiar with ABC's laws, rules and regulations applicable to the operation of ABC-licensed establishments.
- 4. This declaration is made in support of the City's Planning Department recommendation for revocation of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10 ("CUP"), issued to Industry Theater, a concert venue/nightclub ("the club"), located at 43145 Business Center Parkway #103, Lancaster.
- 5. In or about August 2013, through Department resources I learned of a Facebook posting of an upcoming rave party at the location. Rave parties have been a law enforcement problem in the past, resulting in numerous calls for service. I saw an advertisement for an upcoming rave party to be held at the Industry Theater. I determined that it was necessary to conduct an ABC compliance inspection.
- 6. On August 20, 2013, I called business owner and ABC license holder, Tully Huffaker and informed him that I wanted to conduct an ABC compliance inspection at the club. We agreed upon a time later that day. I went to the club at the agreed upon time, with a Lancaster Public Safety Officer and met with Mr. Huffaker.
- 7. I asked him about the rave party I had seen advertised. He acknowledged his intent to have the party and stated that it was going to be a "lock-in" party: patrons would pay at the door and camp in the club overnight.

- 8. I asked if he knew that ABC licensees are subject to search, seizure and inspection; he said no, but agreed to it. We entered the office. I wanted to investigate the ledgers he is required to keep that document his alcohol purchases from licensed distributors. Mr. Huffaker said he didn't have a ledger, never had had one, and doesn't keep any receipts of his alcohol purchases.
- 9. As authorized under ABC regulations, I opened the desk drawer. I observed a plastic bag containing a green leafy material. Based on my experience and training, after examining and smelling it, I concluded the bag contained marijuana. I asked Mr. Huffaker who the bag belonged to; he acknowledged it was his. He confirmed that it was marijuana and stated that it was for his personal use. I asked if he had any medical problems, and he said he did not. I issued Mr. Huffaker a citation for possession of a controlled substance.
- 10. I asked Mr. Huffaker whether the people who rent the club for concert or other event had their own ABC licenses. He said they did not, and that they used his license.
- I asked Mr. Huffaker who runs the bar during concerts and other events. He stated that he didn't have regular servers, and that whoever is renting the brings their own servers. I asked if he had copies of the certificates documenting that these servers had had the requisite Responsible Beverage Service training; he said he did not.
- 12. At the Lancaster station on August 22, 2013, I ran a report of the calls for service by LASD to the location. This report showed that there have been seven other incidents at the club that resulted in calls for service between October 2012 and August 2013; most occurred after the shooting incident. These included fights and arguments in the parking lot, and a false report of bombs having been planted in the club. A true and correct copy of the Calls for Service compilation is attached as Exhibit "H."

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.

DECLARATION OF ANTHONY PEREZ

I, Anthony Perez, declare and state as follows:

- 1. I am over the age of eighteen and am not a party to this action. Except as otherwise indicated, the facts set forth herein are known to me personally, or have been determined by my review of official City records. If called upon as a witness, I could and would competently testify thereto.
- 2. I am a Public Safety Officer for the city of Lancaster (hereafter "City"). I have held this position since October 2012. Prior to that, from March 2009 to September 2012, I was a Code Enforcement Officer for the City. My duties for the City in each of these positions include enforcement of zoning, property maintenance and other regulations of the Lancaster Municipal Code on private real property. I am required to make determinations as to whether activities, uses and/or conditions of structures or premises constitute violations of these laws and to seek their abatement.
- 3. This declaration is made in support of the City's Planning Department recommendation for revocation of Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10 ("CUP"), issued to Industry Theater located at 43145 Business Center Parkway #103, a concert venue/nightclub (hereafter, "the club"). I have reviewed the CUP and its conditions.
- 4. On October 29, 2013, I did an internet search for "photos taken at Industry Theater from 2013." The results of this search depicted activities and/or conditions that constitute violations of the conditions of the CUP. I made screen prints of the photos. True and correct copies of some of the screen prints are attached collectively hereto as Exhibit "__." The following is a brief description of each.
- 5. Exhibit G-1, dated April 30, 2013, depicts a performer on the stage at the club; he is holding a bottle of Corona beer.
- 6. Exhibit G-2, dated September 14, 2013, depicts two people outside behind the club; the young woman is holding what appears to be a can of Coors beer, and the young man is holding what appears to be a bottle of liquor.

- 7. Exhibit G-3 is an enlarged photo from September 14, 2013; it depicts the same young woman from Exhibit G-2 holding again what appears to be a can of Coors beer, outside behind the club with three other young women and a man.
- 8. Exhibit G-4, dated May 4, 2013, depicts a display table with pipes, "bongs" and other miscellaneous marijuana paraphernalia.
- 9. Exhibit G-5 is an enlarged screen print taken from the Industry Theater's Facebook page. It depicts a flyer for a concert/show on Saturday, July 27, 2013, and indicates that the event starts at 3:00 p.m.
- 10. Exhibit G-6 is another enlarged screen print taken from the Industry Theater's Facebook page. It depicts a flyer for a concert on Friday, March 29, 2013, and indicates that the event ends at 2:00 a.m. It also indicates that the club has a smoking patio.
- 11. On October 30, 2013, I viewed the Industry Theater's Facebook page, and observed postings for some events from 2013. I again made screen prints from the Facebook page. True and correct copies of some of them are also attached collectively as Exhibit G. The following is a brief description.
- 12. Exhibit G-7 depicts a posting titled "the Teen Takeover!" It indicates that this event, for ages 13 17, has live music, dance performances and a DJ, and is held every Wednesday at the club between 6:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m..
- 13. Exhibit G-8 depicts two postings for the club's Haunted House. The top posting shows dates the event will be open, including Wednesday, October 23, 2013 and Wednesday, October 30, 2013. The bottom posting shows that the event as being open on Sunday, October 26, 2013, from 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.
- 14. The activities/events depicted in these exhibits constitute violations of the conditions of the CUP, including, but not limited to, the following:
 - a. Condition No. 9 of the CUP prohibits the presence of open containers and the consumption of beer in any portion of the club outside of the lounge, which is separated from the stage.

- b. Condition No. 11 of the CUP prohibits the consumption of alcoholic beverages in the parking area or other exterior areas of the premises.
- c. Condition No. 25 provides that a strict "No in-and-out" policy must be enforced, to restrict guests from entering and exiting the premises repeatedly.
- d. Condition No. 3 of the CUP prohibits, in pertinent part, concerts and private events from starting before 7:00 p.m. on Saturdays, and from ending later than 1:00 a.m. on any day. Condition No. 3 also prohibits any events from being held on Wednesdays or Sundays.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.

A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LANCASTER, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. 11-10

WHEREAS, a conditional use permit has been requested by Tully Huffaker, Industry Theater, to allow a concert venue/nightclub with on-sale consumption of alcoholic beverages (Alcoholic Beverage Control Type 42, on-sale beer and wine - public premises), private events, and the request for a waiver for the normal distance requirements pursuant to Section 17.42.040.C of the Lancaster Municipal Code, for a site located at 43145 Business Center Parkway #103 in the LI (Light Industrial) Zone, as shown on the attached site map; and

WHEREAS, an application for the above-described conditional use permit has been filed pursuant to the regulations contained in Article I of Chapter 17.32 and Chapter 17.42, of the Lancaster Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, a notice of intention to consider the granting of a Conditional Use Permit has been given as required in Article V of Chapter 17.32 of the Lancaster Municipal Code, and in Section 65905 of the Government Code of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, staff has performed necessary investigations, prepared a written report, and recommended approval of this conditional use application, subject to conditions; and

WHEREAS, public notice was provided as required by law and a public hearing was held on October 17, 2011 and November 21, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) per Section 15061(b)(3), which states that "where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA". As the proposed project is a use permit for the sale of alcohol at an existing facility, no impacts on environmental resources would be expected to occur."

WHEREAS, this Commission hereby adopts the following findings in support of approval of a waiver of normal distance requirements pursuant to Section 17.42.040.C of the Lancaster Municipal Code:

- The on-site sale of alcohol at the purposed Industry Theater concert venue/nightclub and private events will meet a specific need, because it will provide increased public convenience through a type of venue that is limited within the Antelope Valley.
- 2. The distance waiver to allow on-site sale of alcohol within 300 feet of a religious assembly is not expected to result in adverse effect upon such use because restrictions will be placed on the days and time of operation of Industry Theaters. The business will be operated by well-trained staff in a safe, controlled, and

well-organized manner that will not affect the existing religious assembly, because the Industry Theater would be in operation during the evenings and weekends when the religious assembly is not in operation, security would be provided on-site, and patrol of parking lot would take place.

WHEREAS, this Commission hereby adopts the following findings in support of approval of this application:

- 1. The proposed Industry Theater and the related on-site sale of alcohol would be located within an existing building, and will be in conformance with the General Plan land use designation of (LI) Light Industrial.
- 2. The requested alcohol use at the location proposed will not:
 - a. Adversely affect the health, peace, comfort, or welfare of persons residing or working in the surrounding area, because the business would be located in the Light Industrial zone where no homes are located. Industry Theater would be open on weekends and weekdays with the exception of Wednesdays and Sundays, and the hours of operation would be between the hours of 5:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m., when most of the neighboring businesses would be closed. Private events of less than 50 persons would be allowed to operate between the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday, and between the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. on weekdays. No events shall occur on Wednesdays and Sundays.
 - b. Be materially detrimental to the use, enjoyment, or valuation of property of other persons located in the vicinity of the site, because City development standards have been met, adequate parking is provided, and on-site security would be provided.
 - c. Jeopardize, endanger or otherwise constitute a menace to the public health, safety, or general welfare, because adequate sewer, water, drainage, and improvements are available.
- 3. The proposed site is adequately served:
 - a. By Business Center Parkway, which is of sufficient width and improved to carry the anticipated daily vehicle trips such use would generate; and
 - b. By other public or private service facilities, including sewer, water, fire, and police services as required.

4. The proposed use will not result in a significant effect on the environment, because the site is already developed and adequately served by necessary street and utilities.

WHEREAS, this Commission hereby adopts the following Conditional Use Permit findings, per Section 17.42.050, in support of approval of this application:

- 1. The proposed use as a concert venue/nightclub and private event with on-sale consumption of alcoholic beverages (Alcoholic Beverage Control Type 42, on-sale beer and wine public premises) is located in the LI (Light Industrial) Zone, which permits alcoholic beverages to be sold for on-site consumption with a conditional use permit.
- 2. The proposed use will not adversely affect the nearby residents and facilities primarily devoted to use by children, families, and the general public, after giving consideration to the distance or proximity of the proposed alcoholic beverage establishment to residential districts, schools (public or private), day care centers, public parks, playgrounds and other places of religious worship, hospitals, clinics or other health care facilities, because adequate restrictions have been placed on the hours of operation and security and control of potential loitering is being required, which will provide an adequate level of safety.
- 3. The proposed concert venue/nightclub and private event serves the public convenience and necessity based on all factors outlined in Section 17.42.060 of the Municipal Code, because restrictions are placed on the operation of the use, including limiting alcohol sales and consumption to a 682 square-foot restricted lounge area, and security provisions are required that will adequately ensure that the use will not adversely affect nearby uses and the general public.

LI (Light Industrial) Zone

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt Resolution No. 11-18 approving Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10.

<u>BACKGROUND</u>: There have been no prior hearings before either the City Council or the Planning Commission concerning this property.

GENERAL PLAN DESIGNATION, EXISTING ZONING AND LAND USE: The subject location is designated LI (Light Industrial) by the General Plan and is zoned LI (Light Industrial), and is currently a 6,000± square-foot vacant unit located within a 44,428± square-foot Office/Industrial building. The General Plan designation, zoning, and land use of the surrounding properties are as follows:

<u>PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS</u>: The site is bounded to the east by Business Center Parkway, which is improved with two lanes in each direction. All utilities are available to serve the site.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW: The proposed project is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) per Section 15061(b)(3), which states that "where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA". As the proposed project is a use permit for a concert venue/nightclub with sale of alcohol at an existing facility, no impacts on environmental resources would be expected to occur.

<u>LEGAL NOTICE</u>: Notice of Public Hearing was mailed to all property owners within a 500-foot radius of the project, posted in three places, posted on the subject property, and noticed in a newspaper of general circulation per prescribed procedure.

ANALYSIS: The applicant, Tully Huffaker, is seeking approval of a conditional use permit to allow a concert venue/nightclub at Industry Theater with on-sale consumption of alcoholic beverages (Alcoholic Beverage Control Type 42, on-sale beer and wine for public premises). A conditional use permit is required to operate the entertainment use/night club per Lancaster Municipal Code Section 17.16.070.A.1.h, and is required for an Alcoholic Beverage Control license per Lancaster Municipal Code Section 17.42.030 for a primary on-sale beverage establishment. A key issue in reviewing this request is whether a waiver should be granted under Section 17.42.040.C of the Municipal Code. Related questions, such as whether operation restrictions should be placed on the use, also must be evaluated, but can only be done within the context of the waiver issue.

The applicant proposes to ultimately operate between the hours of 5:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m., Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday; starting with weekends and one day per week.

The entertainment events would include music, such as live bands, DJs, and dancing occurring on the weekends and occasionally during the week. The applicant proposes to establish a venue for local performers to reach audiences of all ages, or restricted ages depending on the performance. The floor plan indicates a stage area of 432 square feet, dance floor of 933 square feet, an age restricted lounge area of 682 square feet, and open lounge area of 1,243 square feet, for a total of 3,290 square feet with an occupancy load of 362 persons.

The applicant has indicated that OPSEC security and in-house security will be provided for large concerts; and that for small events, in-house security would be provided. The applicant specifies that a small event would be considered less than 100 guests with two in-house guards; for 100-250 guests, one outsourced guard and two in-house guards would be provided; and for a large group of between 250-360 people, two outsourced guards and two in-house guards would be provided for security. The applicant indicates that the parking lot area would be monitored by both in-house and outsourced security. The security as proposed by the applicant would exceed that recommended by the Sheriff's Department, which is a minimum of one security guard per 100 patrons. The applicant indicates that a strict policy will be maintained preventing guests from entering and exiting the venue, and from loitering in the parking lot and surrounding properties.

An identification check and ticket sales area is located at the entrance as shown on the floor plan. At point of purchase, a wrist ban would be provided identifying patrons who are 21 years of age and older. All patrons would continue through the hallway to the open area where the stage and dance floor and available seating are located. An age restricted lounge approximately 682 square feet would be available for patrons 21 years of age and older, where alcohol would be served. A staff member stationed at the restricted lounge door would check wrist bands to ensure only those persons 21 years of age and older enter the lounge. Conditions have been added to ensure that no alcohol sales or alcohol consumption are allowed outside the lounge area. In addition, signs would be posted that state that no alcoholic beverages are allowed beyond that point, as well as a staff member that would ensure no one leaves the lounge with any alcoholic beverage. The applicant would be limited to operating and serving alcohol within the restricted lounge to two hours prior to an event, and one hour after the event, but in no case would this occur outside the hours of operation of the facility.

Sufficient parking exists for the project; parking for the entertainment center is calculated at one automobile space for every 45 square feet of floor area (1/45) for uses where seats are not fixed. The entertainment use at 6,000 square feet would require 134 parking spaces, and 350 parking spaces are provided for the industrial facility. According to the parking calculation, the only uses operating after 5:00 p.m. on weekdays would be the church and the proposed use, and the uses would not be opened at the same time. Industry Theater would not be open on Wednesday and Sunday to avoid any conflict with the church. All other businesses are open Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Separation Distance Requirements. The City's alcohol ordinance Section 17.42.040 establishes separation distance requirements between certain types of alcohol sellers and uses identified as "sensitive uses." This provision in the ordinance goes to the core reason that the City has enacted regulations for alcohol sales, which is to deal with the potential for negative external effects on adjacent areas that certain alcohol establishments can create. These effects can include noise, loitering, trash and debris, or increased need for police services, for example, but are not intended to include more social concerns (whether the consumption of alcohol in the community is good or bad, for example). The ordinance makes a distinction between retail uses that sell alcohol as an incidental activity (grocery stores, drug stores, etc.) and those that are primary alcohol sellers, such as bona fide restaurant, nightclubs or bars that sell alcoholic beverages for on-site consumption are considered primary on-sale beverage establishments. Incidental activity (grocery stores, drug stores) are considered to have external negative effects that are minimal, and the positive effects that the retail uses provide to the community outweigh these negative effects. Primary alcohol sellers, on the other hand, are considered much more likely to create adverse effects on surrounding uses.

Waiver of Distance Requirements. The City's alcohol ordinance (Section 17.42.040.C) contains a provision to allow for a waiver of the normal distance requirements of the alcohol ordinance. The waiver provision acts as a "safety valve" when application of normal requirements produces results that are not in line with the overall intent of the ordinance. The waiver provision requires that two findings be made: first, that the alcohol beverage establishment will serve a specific community need; and second, that the approved waiver is not expected to create an adverse effect on adjacent property, uses, or residents. These provisions are written broadly to allow for a fair evaluation of specific circumstances. The City has approved two waiver requests in the past. The Planning

Commission approved a waiver of distance requirement in November 2008 of the location of the V.F.W. Post location on Division Street, a site that is within 300 feet of residential property and within 1,000 feet of a school. In this case, the Commission felt that a V.F.W. Post met a specific community need, and that any impact on adjacent uses was expected to be minimal, because of the private nature of the facility. The Planning Commission approved a waiver of distance requirement for off-site sale and consumption of alcohol (Type 20, sale of beer and wine only) at an existing minimarket at Cross point Development located at 1006 West Avenue H; and a request for a waiver for a site adjacent to residentially zoned property.

As noted previously, the alcohol ordinance sets separation distance to help minimize potential conflicts between certain types of alcohol establishments and sensitive uses, but also allows for a waiver of those in cases where specific need is identified, and the use is not expected to adversely affect the adjacent area. There are a number of issues and concerns that can legitimately be considered by the Planning Commission in analyzing this request:

- 1. The applicant has pointed out that this site for Industry Theatre was specifically located in the Business Park to reduce risk to surrounding environment. Industry Theatre is located in an area where the surrounding businesses are predominately closed by 5 p.m. on weekdays and during the weekends would not compromise or negatively affect surrounding businesses. The closest entertainment venue is the Elks Club which is a private club. Security would be provided to patrol the inside and outside of the establishment to prevent any loitering, increased need for police services, and to reduce any negative impacts to the existing industrial area.
- 2. The site is located within 300 feet of the church to the north of the project site. The conditional use permit indicated that the church would be opened from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. on Wednesday, and 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Sunday. Industry Theatre would operate 5 p.m. to 2 a.m., Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday to avoid any conflict with the existing church.
- 3. The applicant has indicated that the sale of alcohol is necessary for the economic success of the business. Alcohol sales and service would be limited to a secured 682 square feet lounge monitored by on-site staff for those persons 21 years of age and older, and would only occur during a set time. The applicant would be required to comply with all standard conditions from the alcohol ordinance for on-sale alcoholic beverage establishments (Section 17.42.070). In analysis of the conditional use for alcohol sales, staff reviewed factors regarding public convenience and necessity. Operation of the entertainment uses will be conducted by well-trained staff in a manner that will maintain the atmosphere of the business park.
- 4. The Sheriff's Department was contacted as part of the initial review of this request. The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (Lancaster Station) was not opposed to the issuance of the conditional use permit, based on a conducted investigation and the applicant's agreement to added conditions.

- 5. The City's alcohol ordinance assumes that a primary alcohol seller such as a nightclub may have a negative effect on surrounding sensitive uses. The waiver process essentially places the burden of proof for the waiver on the applicant; in other words it is the applicant's responsibility to justify granting the waiver, not the City's responsibility to justify the separation distance established by the ordinance.
- 6. The Planning Commission has the ability to place restrictions on the operations of an alcohol establishment, provided that the restrictions are reasonably related to addressing potential negative effects. In the past, these restrictions have included conditions related to security on and off the site, and hours of operation. Staff feels that the proposed concert venue/nightclub with conditions of approval would ensure that the project does not adversely impact the neighboring businesses, because it is located adjacent to an industrial area and business park.

Staff believes that the applicant's proposal would provide the City with a concert venue/nightclub that currently has limited availability in the Antelope Valley, and that the alcohol beverage establishment will meet a specific community need in conjunction with the concert.

Staff is recommending approval of the proposed alcohol use and entertainment use for Industry Theater, because the proposed project meets the requirements of the zone, it will meet a community need providing a concert venue/nightclub, it will not adversely affect nearby residences or businesses, because the entertainment will occur within the building, and security would be provided inside and outside the premises. The conditions of approval have been included, which would ensure that the safety and general welfare of the surrounding area would be maintained. Staff believes the Planning Commission could make a favorable determination in support of the proposal.

SUBJECT:

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. 11-10

Request:

A Conditional Use Permit to allow a concert venue/nightclub and private events with on-sale consumption of alcoholic beverages (Alcoholic Beverage Control Type 42, on-sale beer and wine-public premises), and a request for waiver under Section 17.42.040.C of the Lancaster Municipal Code to allow the sale of beer and wine within 300 feet of a religious assembly area, in the LI (Light Industrial) Zone.

Discussion:

On October 17, 2011, the Planning Commission requested for the applicant, Tully Huffaker and Pastor Marsh from New Life Community Church, to meet and determine if an agreement could be reached. On October 31, 2011, the applicant and the Pastor met to discuss the proposed request for a concert venue, and to reduce the potential for negative external effects from the sale of alcohol from Industry Theatre to New Life Community Church. The applicant and Pastor Marsh came to the following agreement:

- The applicant agrees to only sell beer and wine (ABC Type 42, on-sale beer and wine for public premises), and would not request an upgrade to full general liquor license. Any upgrade to the liquor license would require a conditional use permit.
- 2. No on-site alcohol consumption prior to door opening. In no case would the doors be opened to public more than 60 minutes prior to start of show. This does not preclude set up time by the bands or management.
- 3. Sales service and consumption of alcoholic beverages are permitted no sooner than one hour prior to the concert, and no later than one hour after the conclusion of the concert, or per the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control Guidelines.
- 4. Any lines to enter the venue must be formed to the south of Suite 103 (Industry Theatre), away from the entrance of New Life Community Church.

- 5. Hours of operation for concert venue and large private events over 50 people would be limited to 7:00 pm to 1:00 am on Friday and Saturday, and 5:00 pm to 1:00 am on weekdays, with the exception of Wednesdays and Sundays. No events shall take place on Wednesday or Sundays.
- 6. Hours of operation for small private events with fewer than 50 persons would be limited to 10:00 am to 1:00 am on Friday and Saturday, and between 10:00 am and 12:00 am (midnight) on weekdays, with the exception of Wednesday. No events shall take place on Wednesday and Sunday.
- 7. Parking for Industry Theatre will be located at the south and east end of the parking lot (see site plan), and will be sectioned off by the applicant with cones, or as determined by the landlord. Any concerns about parking would be handled by management.
- 8. The applicant will ensure that security is available prior to the door opening.
- 9. The applicant agrees to work with New Life Community Church to avoid conflicts regarding events that are scheduled on weekdays.

On November 14, 2011, staff met with Tully Huffaker and Pastor Marsh to discuss the project and the request to add private events. The applicant would host various types of private events, such as wedding receptions, quinceñeras, birthdays, dances, and other similar conference/meeting type events. For events less with than 50 persons, the hours of operation would be between 10:00 am and 1:00 am on weekends, and 10:00 am to 12:00 am on weekdays, with the exception of Wednesday and Sundays. There will be no events on Wednesday and Sunday. Private events would be closed to the public, no tickets sold at the door, with mandatory two in-house security personnel provided when alcohol is being sold. Staff has added conditions per the attached conditions list.

Staff is recommending approval of the proposed alcohol use and entertainment use for Industry Theater, because the proposed project meets the requirements of the zone, it will meet a community need providing a concert venue/nightclub, the entertainment will occur within the building, security would be provided inside and outside the premises, and Pastor Marsh from New Life Community Church is not opposed to the project after meeting with applicant Tully Huffaker. The conditions of approval have been included, which would ensure that the safety and general welfare of the surrounding area would be maintained. Staff believes the Planning Commission could make a favorable determination in support of the proposal.

Recommendation:

Adopt Resolution No. 11-18 approving Conditional Use Permit No. 11-10.

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

The City of Lancaster has reviewed your request to change your Alcohol Beverage Control License Type 42 to a Type 40, in order to allow minors on the premises. The City has determined that this request may be processed administratively without a formal hearing. This determination is based on the fact that the basic operation of the business, and any potential effect on adjacent uses, will not be changed by this modification.

We responded to the location (43145 Business Center Pkwy, Lancaster) regarding an Assault with a deadly weapon call (T-24). The call stated Victim was taken into unknown vehicle. The call was later updated S/1 vehicle, Black 745 BMW, S/2 vehicle Camaro Silver last seen towards Division Street, See attached copy of call.

After receiving the call Deputy Edwards immediately coordinated the call by requesting Emergency radio traffic. Deputy Edwards had assisting units take containment spots on the front (111T1 Deputy Williams #529699), and back (112A Deputy Spears #528102) of the location, along with units on Division Street/Business Center Pkwy (Division Street /K-4, 111B, Deputy Moreno #532058, Business Center Pkwy/ Avenue K-10 111A, Deputy Stamsek #532057). Deputy Edwards further requested that Medical Rescue (902R) staged in the area.

Upon arrival at the location we located an individual (later identified as MB/102890, VMB) in a dirt field lot located in the north/east corner of Division Street/Business Center Pkwy, and Avenue K-8. VMB was laying face down with his head to the north and his feet to the south, approximately sixty (60) feet north of the NCBL (north curb line) of Avenue K-8, and approximately thirty (30) yards east of the ECBL (east curb line) of Division Street. It should be noted Division Street turns into Business Center Pkwy at Avenue K-8.

After seeing V/ Deputy Edwards again requested Emergency radio traffic on his Sheriff Hand held radio (Disp-15), and advised that we were detaining an individual in the desert lot. Deputy Edwards did this due to the fact we could not see V/ See right hand which was located under his body. A few seconds later we were able to Identify the fact V/ See had received a gun shot wound to his right forearm area. Deputy Edwards then requested Medical (902R) to our location for V/Waller. LA County Fire Engine #135, Squad #129, under the Supervision of Captain Bartram responded to the location and began treating V/

Just prior to the arrival of Fire I contacted V/ who stated he was inside the location (IT) club located at 43145 Business Center Pkwy, Lancaster. V/ said a fight started inside the club, and that the individuals involved in the fight left the club. V/ told me that as people started leaving the club people started shooting. V/ stated he ran towards the field (located north/east of the club). V/ said he started feeling tired so he laid down on the ground. V/ asked me several times if he had been shot during this time. V/ refused to provide me with an address or phone number, he only provided me with his name, date of birth, and said he resides in Victorville. I observed a black cell phone (EV-10) laying on the ground next to V/

A few seconds later LA County Fire arrived on scene and started treating V/VIIII. One of the Paramedics handed me the cell phone (EV-10) just prior to transporting V/VIIII. V/VIIII was then transported to Antelope Valley Hospital (AVH, 1600 West Avenue J, Lancaster, (661) 949-5000) a short time later.

During this time Deputy Edwards started a Incident Command Post just East of the location on Avenue K-

We received information from 114 A (Deputy Klump #483162, and Deputy Markman #535063) who was at Antelope Valley Hospital on a un-related incident at the time that numerous gunshot victims were arriving at the location (later identified as MB/032387, V/MB/), MB/061175, V/MB/MB/111094, V/MB/MB/) for further see Deputy Klump, and Deputy Markman's supplemental report under same file number. Deputy Klump requested several units code-3 to his location (AVH) due to several victims arriving, as well as numerous party goers arriving at the Hospital (AVH).

I requested a tactical frequency from SCC, and had all assisting unit's switch to A-tac 1, and started a Major Incident Log (see attached).

At 0227 Hrs a Gray/Silver Saturn arrived at Lancaster Sheriff's Station where a 246R call was dispatched Call T-26 see attached call. 112 Deputy Forbes # 529690 responded to Lancaster Station and advised the vehicle left the location (IT Club) during the incident, and received a window shot out of the vehicle, Deputy Forbes also responded to AVH where he received additional witness interviews (for further see Deputy Forbes supplemental report under same file number).

I was later advised by Deputy Klump that V/ arrived at AVH a short time later by LA County Fire, as well as a fifth (5th) victim (later identified as Chambers, Kevin MB/041585, V/Chambers) who was assaulted during the fight with hands and fists causing great bodily injury requiring medical treatment (for further see supplemental report by Deputy Klump).

l also requested GSR (gun shot residue) evidence be collected from all five (5) victims (see Deputy Klumps supplemental report for further).

Deputy Klump advised us that he, 113 Deputy Bush #526161, 111D Deputy Fletcher #506784, collected several witness statements from the party goers, and victims who were at the location during the incident (see Deputy Klump, Deputy Bush, And Deputy Fletchers supplemental report).

Deputy Klump also advised he also received bullet fragments recovered by AVH Doctors from V/

Deputy Spears received statements from the business owner, and several other witnesses at the location (for further see his supplemental report under same file number).

Deputy Williams received statements from a security guard working at the location, and several witnesses (for further see his supplemental report).

I was advised by Deputy Spears, and Deputy Williams that they received statements that a large fight started inside the location (IT Club) and ended up in the front of the location in the parking lot. I was also advised that a Armed Security Guard working at the location engaged in a gunfight with (shoot bullets) from his firearm at suspects that were shooting at party goers exiting the location. I was also advised that a firearm magazine was located at the location, and two vehicles described as (Black BMW 745I, and Silver Camaro Z28 with Chrome wheels was seen leaving the location with several suspects who were shooting at party goers, for further see their supplemental report).

Deputy Klump advised us that he had a vehicle at AVH that was used to transport a victim to AVH from the location after the incident (for further see Deputy Klumps Supplemental report).





I responded to the Lancaster station lobby and contacted the victim who stated the following: While at the incident location she heard 5 gunshots from the entrance of the building. She told me when she heard the gunshots she exited the rear of the building using the emergency exit. She stated when she was standing outside of the building she heard 4 more gunshots coming from rear of the building (in close proximity to her). She ran back inside of the incident location and waited for everything to "Calm down." She told me she waited several minutes after the gunfire stopped to exit the building. She exited the rear emergency exit (west side) and walked around the northern portion of the building to her vehicle. Once she saw her vehicle she noticed the drivers side rear passenger window had been shattered from gunfire (D/1 of 1 - 2' X 2', single pane, causing \$300 in damage)

I photographed the damage, copied the photos to CD-R, and booked them at Lancaster station (EV-15). Report memo issued.

I responded to the incident location parking lot and canvassed the area of the shooting on foot. I saw three shell casings on the pavement near the north east corner of the building. I also saw two shell casings in the handicap parking stalls in front of the incident location.

The purpose of the supplemental report is to provide additional and active information regarding the above file number.

I responded to 43145 Division Street, Lancaster regarding an 245PC call. On arrival, I took a containment spot on the front of the location. I was contacted by W/1 club Security Officer Turhoue Griffin (MB/09-25-87, 310-46-46), Street Palmdale CA) who stated the following:

He was working at the front door area of the club, when approximately 4 to 5 separate fights started inside the club. He along with other on duty security officers broke up the fights. During the incidents some of the patrons got pepper sprayed. W/1 further stated people started running out of the club due to pepper spray affecting them. W/1 stated he returned to the front door area and saw 4 unknown male blacks run out the club in get inside a silver "Camro Z28" NFD sitting in the parking lot just east of the front door. He also saw 2 unknown male blacks run in get into a black "BMW 745Li" NFD sitting on Division street.

W/1 stated approximately 3-4 minutes later the males blacks inside the BMW started shooting towards the club entrance from Division, then drove into the parking lot and passed by the front door and continued shooting towards the front door of the club. W/1 stated he pulled out his gun (Smith &Wesson 45 auto model 457, serial number TDP6359) and returned fire toward the vehicle, however he was unsure if he hit the vehicle. After the vehicle drove by W/1 stated he started closing the second set of doors to the club to keep people from leaving. W/1 stated that when he saw the male black inside of the Silver Camro drive by the front entrance and also start to shoot toward the front door he took cover. The Camro then continued around the building to rear of the location and he heard more gun shots. W/1 stated he then called 911 to report the incident.

contacted W/2 club security officer (MB/06-13-86, 4) Avenue, Compton CA) who stated the following:

He was working the front door with W/1, when a few fights started inside the club. During the fights he attempted to stop a couple guys from fighting by pepper spraying them. W/2 stated

the two males blacks he sprayed were wearing a red t-shirt in black jeans, the other male black was wearing a white t-shirt in blue jeans NFD. After he sprayed the two, a large crowd of patrons started running out the club. Approximately 2 minutes later he returned to the front door with W/1 then heard guns shots. W/1 then yelled at him to "take cover". W/2 said he then hid behind the walls until the shooting stopped. W/2 stated he did not see who was shooting at the time of the incident.

He was working inside the club area in saw approximately 4-5 different fights break out inside the club at the same time. W/3 stated he along with other club security officer's all assisted in breaking up the fights. Afterwards patrons started leaving the club because of pepper spray in the air. During the commotion inside the club he heard someone inside the club say "he got a gun" but never saw any one with a weapon. W/3 stated as he approached the front door he heard someone shooting and people screaming. W/3 said he then saw security officer W/1 firing his weapon. A few minutes later W/3 said he heard what sounded like gun fire coming from the rear of the club. As he started making his way back through the club to the back door he saw 3 unknown people carrying a male black NFD through the club and out the front door.

I contacted W/4 club security officer (MH/01-19-84, 661-39-44).

Palmdale CA) who stated the following:

He was posted near the rear exit door of the club, when all of a sudden he heard gun shots and people started running. W/4 stated he then ran to his vehicle and left the location, and did not return until W/3 called him via cell phone to return. W/4 further stated he did not see who was shooting.

It should be noted I took control of W/1Griffin weapon (Smith &Wesson model 457, serial #TDP6359) for evidence. His weapon was in his holster and had one bullet and the chamber, and 3 bullets in the magazine. W/1's weapon magazine held a total of 7 rounds. W/1 told me he keeps one bullet chambered for a total of 8 rounds. W/1 also gave me 3 expelled casing, he stated someone had picked up and gave to him from his weapon. I issued W/1 a copy of a receipt for property-firearm. I later turned over possession of the firearm to the crime lab Deputy Davison #444001. See attached firearm receipt.

I also located two 22 casing in the parking lot approximately 50 feet from the front door. I notified crime lab of all my finding. I also saw a copy of W/1 security guard card along with his firearm permit. They both were valid.





ARTICLE 3. Rights and Obligations of Licensees [23355 - 23405.3] (Article 3 added by Stats. 1953, Ch. 152.)

^{23355.} Except as otherwise provided in this division and subject to the provisions of Section 22 of Article XX of the Constitution, the licenses provided for in Article 2 of this chapter authorize the person to whom issued to exercise the rights and privileges specified in this article and no others at the premises for which issued during the year for which issued.

ARTICLE 1. In General [25600 - 25622] (Article 1 added by Stats. 1953, Ch. 152.)

^{25607.} (a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), it is unlawful for any person or licensee to have upon any premises for which a license has been issued any alcoholic beverages other than the alcoholic beverage which the licensee is authorized to sell at the premises under his or her license. It shall be presumed that all alcoholic beverages found or located upon premises for which licenses have been issued belong to the person or persons to whom the licenses were issued. Every person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor. The department may seize any alcoholic beverages found in violation of this section.

(b) A bona fide public eating place for which an on-sale beer and wine license has been issued may have upon the premises brandy, rum, or liqueurs for use solely for cooking purposes.
