M 1. Approve the City Council/Successor Agency/Financing/ Power Authority Regular Meeting Minutes of October 13, 2015.

CONSENT CALENDAR

- **CC 2.** Approve the Check and Wire Registers for September 27, 2015 through October 10, 2015 in the amount of \$3,474,106.34.

At each regular City Council Meeting, the City Council is presented with the financial claims (invoices) against the City for purchase of materials, supplies, services, and capital projects for checks and Automated Clearing House (ACH) payments issued the prior two to three weeks. This process provides the City Council the opportunity to review the expenses of the City. The justifying backup information for each expenditure is available in the Finance Department.

CC 3. Accept and approve the September 2015, Monthly Report of Investments as submitted.

Each month, the Finance Department prepares a report listing the investments for all separate entities under the jurisdiction of the City as identified in the City's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report, the City of Lancaster and the Lancaster Housing Authority.

CC 4. Adopt Ordinance No. 1008, amending the City zoning plan for a total of 80± acres of a 725-acre site generally bounded by Avenue G, Avenue H, 93rd Street West and 107th Street West, known as Zone Change No. 14-03, rezoning the subject property from R-7,000 (single family residential, minimum lot size 7,000 square feet), R-10,000 (single family residence, minimum lot size 10,000 square feet), and R-15,000 (single family residential, minimum lot size 15,000 square feet) to RR-2.5 (Rural Residential, one dwelling unit per 2.5 acres).

Sustainable Power (sPower) Group, LLC, has proposed to construct and operate a 100-megawatt (MW) photovoltaic (PV) solar energy generating facility generally bounded by Avenue G, Avenue H, 93rd Street West, and 107th Street West. Approximately 80 acres (the property located west of 105th Street West) is designated as UR (Urban Residential), zoned R-7,000, R-10,000, and R-15,000. The remainder of the project site is covered by Development Agreement No. 89-01, which allows for the development of solar facilities with a Conditional Use Permit. The City's zoning code does not permit the development of commercial-style solar energy facilities on property designated for urban uses. Therefore, amendment of the General Plan land use designation to non-urban residential and rezoning of the subject property to RR-2.5 is necessary to allow this facility to move forward.

CC 5. Approve agreement for acquisition of real property between the City of Lancaster and Federal National Mortgage Association for property located at 1164 West Avenue J-11, as part of the approved Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP 3).

On February 22, 2011, pursuant to the Dodd-Frank Act of 2010, the City Council received and appropriated \$2,364,566 for the Neighborhood Stabilization Program from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for NSP 3. The City received \$1,096,136 in Program Income revenues from the sales of the NSP 3 homes which will be used to acquire, rehabilitate, and then resell the foreclosed homes. In addition, the City has \$492,959 available from the original NSP 3 award, both of which will be used to purchase, rehabilitate, and then resell foreclosed homes in the expanded target areas as outlined in the Second Substantial Amendment to the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Consolidated Annual Action Plan approved May 27, 2014.

CC 6. Adopt **Resolution No. 15-56**, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Lancaster, California, declaring its intention to accept an Offer of Dedication located on 105th Street West, north of Avenue J, and declaring the public necessity therefor.

An Offer of Dedication was executed May 4, 1988, as part of the County's requirements for Tract Map No. 35446 to provide an offer of right-of-way for 105th Street West. The City is now accepting the Offer of Dedication. This acceptance will be recorded in the office of the County Recorder.

NEW BUSINESS

NB 1. Youth Commission

Recommendation:

Nominate and appoint Daniella Hidalgo, Danielle Stafford, Jasmine Denise Johnson, Stephanie Orellana, Samira Carpenter, Jillian Poonoosamy and Justin Urbanski to the 2015-2016 Lancaster Youth Commission.

The Lancaster Youth Commission was created by the City Council in January of 1992 to provide a forum for the students of Lancaster to give input regarding the needs and concerns of the youth of this community. Youth Commissioners are nominated by the high schools in the Lancaster area. The schools include: Antelope Valley, Bethel Christian, Lancaster, Eastside, Paraclete and Quartz Hill High School. The Commission meets once a month from the start of the school year until the end of May.

NB 2. General Municipal Election – April 12, 2016

Recommendations:

Adopt **Resolution No. 15-57**, calling for the holding of a General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, April 12, 2016, for the election of certain officers as required by the provisions of the applicable laws of the state of California and the City of Lancaster City Charter.

Adopt **Resolution No. 15-58**, requesting the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles to render specified services to the City relating to the conduct of a General Municipal Election to be held Tuesday, April 12, 2016.

Adopt **Resolution No. 15-59**, adopting regulations for candidates for elective office, pertaining to filing fees and candidate statements submitted to the voters at an election to be held Tuesday, April 12, 2016.

Adopt **Resolution No. 15-60**, providing for the conduct of a special runoff election for elective offices in the event of a tie vote at any municipal election.

During odd numbered years, the City Council adopts the necessary resolutions to proceed with the General Municipal Election in April of even-numbered years. These resolutions fulfill certain legal requirements to conduct the General Municipal Election including requesting information and supplies from the County of Los Angeles, establishing guidelines and costs associated with candidate statements, and providing provisions to conduct a special runoff election to resolve a tie vote.

NB 3. Ordinance regulating the use of fire sprinklers in buildings exceeding 10,000 square feet

Recommendation:

Introduce **Ordinance No. 1009**, an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Lancaster, California, repealing Section 15.08.020 of Title 15 of the Lancaster Municipal Code relating to fire sprinkler systems.

The proposed ordinance would require property owners, builders, and developers to adhere to the guidelines contained in the current version of the California Building Code. This will remove the redundant requirements between the California Building Code and the Lancaster Municipal Code limiting the size of buildings without fire sprinklers. It will also allow larger buildings to be constructed without fire sprinklers in which less hazardous occupancies reside, thereby removing unnecessary restrictions and expenses to property owners and developers.

Adopt **Resolution No. 15-61**, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Lancaster, California, confirming the existence of a local emergency in the City of Lancaster, California.

Adopt **Resolution No. 15-62**, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Lancaster, California, requesting State Director of the Office of Emergency Services' concurrence in the existence of a local emergency.

Adopt **Resolution No. 15-63**, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Lancaster, California, requesting the Governor of the State of California to proclaim a state of emergency.

Appropriate \$250,000 from Drainage Maintenance District fund balance to fund emergency response and repairs. Sufficient funds are available in the Drainage Maintenance District fund balance to cover this unanticipated expense.

On Thursday, October 15, 2015, at approximately 4:45 p.m., the City of Lancaster and much of the greater Antelope Valley was hit by a major rainstorm, which produced between three and six inches of rain in some areas over an approximate 3 hour period. This extreme storm event, referred to as the "West Lake Incident," resulted in flash flooding and a tremendous amount of water, debris, and mudflow throughout much of the City. The City sustained some damage to public property and damage to private property, most severe of which was mud and debris intrusion into an identified 15 homes in three areas of west Lancaster. Mud and debris flows also impacted multiple streets and drainage facilities throughout the City, necessitating initial closure of some and ongoing cleanup operations. The City Manager, acting as the Director of Emergency Services for the City per the Lancaster Municipal Code, proclaimed the existence of a local emergency on October 20, 2015. The Proclamation found that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property in the City had arisen.
