## City of Lancaster 2015-2016 Action Plan – Substantial Amendment No. 1

#### **BACKGROUND**

The City of Lancaster proposes to delete a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Activity previously described in the 2015-2016 Annual Action Plan and add three new CDBG activities to the 2015-2016 Annual Action Plan. Pursuant to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regulations and the City of Lancaster Citizen Participation Plan, these changes are considered a "Substantial Amendment" to the 2015-2016 Annual Action Plan that require specific citizen participation actions before the change may be approved by the City Council and submitted to HUD. To allow interested residents the opportunity to review and comment on the proposed changes, the City published a public notice in the Antelope Valley Press on December 28, 2015 informing residents of the availability of the Substantial Amendment document for public review and comment for a period of 30 days from December 28, 2015 to January 26, 2016. The public review and comment period concludes with a public hearing before the City Council on January 26, 2016 at 5:00 p.m. when the City Council will consider the amendment.

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE ACTION PLAN

This amendment is necessary to delete the previously-approved 5<sup>th</sup> Street East/Avenue K Park Improvements to a public facility and to reallocate \$200,000 of CDBG funds to three new public facility activities.

Staff proposes to reallocate these funds to improve Mariposa Park, Pierre Bain Park, and Whit Carter Park. The new activities meets the same Consolidated Plan – Strategic Plan Goals as the activity to be deleted, which is to construct, upgrade, rehabilitate and enhance existing public facilities in service areas comprised of low to moderate income persons.

The tables on the following page outline and show the proposed changes to the 2015-2016 Annual Action Plan Section AP-38 where approved CDBG projects and activities are detailed.
