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#### 1. PROBLEM STATEMENT

The City of Lancaster has instituted several initiatives to encourage more active transportation in light of other health burdens in the community that include asthma, childhood obesity and chronic disease. Child poverty is also a problem in the City of Lancaster with 27.5 percent of children living in poverty. Children ages 6-11 have a poverty rate of 37.3 percent. This is concerning as this elementary school aged population are often walking or riding their bikes to school and parks in the community. Children in poverty are less likely to have the resources to purchase bike helmets and safety equipment.

Contributing to chronic disease and asthma is the poor air quality in the City of Lancaster. Therefore in 2014 Lancaster implemented "YOLO (You Only Live Once) Lancaster" to address health issues in the city that contribute to childhood obesity, chronic disease, and asthma. Active transportation contributes to reduced pollution and increases physical activity, but without adequate pedestrian and bike safety education programs for both those utilizing active transportation and motor vehicle drivers, there will likely be an increase in injuries and fatalities as more people walk and ride their bikes as a result of the city's efforts.

The City of Lancaster has seen an improvement in pedestrian safety for young residents from 2011-2013. In 2011, Lancaster was ranked 11 out of 55 California cities in injuries or fatalities of pedestrians under 15 years of age compared to ranking 24 out of 56 similar sized cities in 2013. According to City data, in 2012, there were three pedestrian fatalities, 56 injuries, and 58 victims compared to 2014 where there were three fatalities, 74 injuries and 73 victims. However, bicycle safety for young riders is getting worse in Lancaster. In 2011, Lancaster was ranked 45 out of 55 similar sized cities, but jumped to a rank of 34 of 56 cities in 2013. According to City data, in 2012 there were 47 bicycle injuries and in 2014 there were 36 injuries and 40 victims. This grant will enable the City of Lancaster to offer young residents under the age of 15, access to bike helmets, bike safety inspections, education via bike rodeos, pedestrian safety workshops and general community education to prevent bicycle and pedestrian motor vehicle injuries and fatalities.

- 4) Conduct 19 bike/pedestrian classroom workshops in an effort to reach approximately 1,200 3<sup>rd</sup> graders.
- 5) Distribute and properly fit 1,000 safety helmets to students and community members participating in rodeos.
- 6) Conduct approximately 200 safety helmet inspections and make necessary adjustments at schools and community events.
- 7) Host 2 bike and pedestrian rodeos in target neighborhoods (based on traffic safety data and Safe Routes to School programs), in an effort to reach 200 school aged children under.
- 8) Provide bicycle and pedestrian safety education at 8 community events in an effort to reach 600 people.
