RED LIGHT PHOTO ENFORCEMENT SYSTEM PH 6.

Mayor Hearns opened the public hearing. The Public Works Director presented the staff report regarding the Red Light Photo Enforcement System.

Discussion from the City Council included: costs of enforcement system vs. Deputies Sheriffs; movement of cameras to new locations as a noticeable decrease of infractions is monitored; synchronization of lights; length of time for changing of lights varies at different intersections; further research will be done on this matter; accidents at intersections have increased; importance of using the red light system; engineering; design elements; importance of this tool; cameras will also record accidents which will make investigations easier; costs to the drivers who do not adhere to the laws; concern for citizen rights in the courts.

The City Attorney stated that the courts have distinguished between the more serious crimes and infractions/tickets in terms of what constitutional rights a person has to a jury trial to face his accusers. The Red Light Camera does require review by an officer before a citation can be issued and is very similar to the radar speed gun. A sworn officer will review the matter and make sure all information that is provided is correct; properly calibrated and that there was in fact, a violation that occurred. There are no constitutional problems with this system and it has been upheld in other cities.

Addressing the Council on this matter:

Lance Hiller – spoke in opposition of this system; importance of engineering; importance of retiming the existing lights; system will not enhance safety. Roy Cook – spoke in opposition of this system; very costly to citizens;

against cameras; find a better method.

Karen Wilson – spoke in favor of this system; stating, what is the price of a life worth; dangerous intersections; high traffic areas; not a perfect solution but something must be done.

There being no further testimony, Mayor Hearns closed the public hearing.
