NEW BUSINESS

HA NB 1. Disposition strategy for property acquired by the Lancaster Housing Authority

Recommendation:

Adopt **Resolution No. HA 01-20**, a resolution of the Lancaster Housing Authority (the "Housing Authority") approving a disposition strategy for the sale of single-family residences.

The Lancaster Housing Authority purchased and rehabilitated three properties. These properties will be marketed and sold to potential homeowners who agree to purchase each property for appraised value and agree to the recording of affordability Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions. The Affordability Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions contain affordability requirements and restrict the resale of the property to be owner occupied for forty-five years. The properties will be listed and sold through the Greater Antelope Valley Association of Realtors members, via the local area Multiple Listing Service to qualified homebuyers. One significant component of the removal of blight and revitalization of mature neighborhoods is the rehabilitation of older housing stock. During the economic downturn, there has been a substantial number of foreclosures on mortgages throughout the City. The City has purchased and rehabilitated several vacant and foreclosed properties. The homes purchased are typically those in need of the most assistance and not purchased by homeowners or investors when listed on the local Multiple Listing Service. The properties have been rehabilitated with energy efficient features, such as dual pane windows, Energy Star appliances, and drought tolerant landscaping, in an effort to reduce the maintenance cost of the home to the new homeowners. Rehabilitation of older properties by the Lancaster Housing Authority helps to eliminate blight in the neighborhoods, and it assists the community by providing much needed affordable homeownership for families. Sale of the rehabilitated properties to homeowners will also help provide a better balance of homeowner to investor in the neighborhoods. By encouraging homeownership, the value attributed to the land as a resource increases, as the conditions of physical deterioration and blight due to poor use of the property, squatting and illegal dumping have been removed. The rejuvenation of these properties is further bolstered with the real potential of providing long-term affordable homeownership.

At each regular City Council Meeting, the City Council is presented with check and ACH/wire registers listing the financial claims (invoices) against the City for purchase of materials, supplies, services, and capital projects issued the prior three to four weeks. This process provides the City Council the opportunity to review the expenditures of the City. Claims are paid via checks, Automated Clearing House (ACH) payments, or federal wires. The justifying backup information for each expenditure is available in the Finance Department.

CC 3. Adopt **Resolution No. 20-16**, authorizing the City Manager, or his designee, to apply for \$8,057,160 of funds available to the City of Lancaster from Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (LACMTA).

Annually, Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority allocates Transportation Development Act (TDA) Article 8 funds to fund unmet transit needs in areas outside the Metro service area. TDA Article 8 revenues will be used by the City to fund the following Council-approved and budgeted Capital Improvement Projects and operating transfers: 2017 Parks Concrete Repair, 16/17 Pavement Management Program R25, 17/18 Pavement Management Program R25, 19/20 Pavement Management Program R25, 10th St West and Avenue J Improvements (HSIP), Avenue I Streetscape Enhancement, 15/16 Lancaster Health District, 2019 Long Line Striping, Pedestrian Gap Closure, 2020 ATP Streets Pedestrian Improvements, 15th St E/ Lancaster Blvd Roundabout, General Operations and Maintenance, Street Maintenance, Transfer Out - MTA Grants

CC 4. Award Public Works Construction Project No. 20-004, 2020 Thermoplastic Striping Refresh Program to Cal Stripe Inc., of Colton, California, in the amount of \$275,999.00 plus additive alternate locations in the amount of \$62,168.65 and a 20% contingency, to refresh fading, long line striping along various roadway segments throughout the City (totaling about 30 roadway miles). Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to sign all documents. This contract is awarded to the lowest responsible bidder per California Public Code Section 22038 (b).

The proposed project is a maintenance effort to refresh approximately 30 roadway miles of long line striping throughout the City. Thermoplastic traffic paint will be used, because it lasts much longer than the alternative and is more visible to the driver, creating safer roadways in the City. Locations were prioritized based on age of existing striping and traffic volumes. This project is funded with Measure R and TDA article 8 funds.

CC 5. Acceptance of Public Works Construction Project No. 17-007 REBID Lancaster Boulevard and 15th Street East Roundabout, HSIPL-5419(042)

- 1. Approve Change Orders 1-3, and increase the total amount of the contract with R.C. Becker and Son, Inc., of Santa Clarita, California, for Public Works Construction Project 17-007 REBID, Lancaster Boulevard and 15th Street East Roundabout, HSIPL-5419(042), by \$120,364.53 for a total revised contract amount of \$1,732,533.69 plus a 10% contingency.
- 2. Accept the work constructed by R.C. Becker and Son, Inc., for Public Works Construction Project No. 17-007 REBID, Lancaster Boulevard and 15th Street East Roundabout, HSIPL-5419(042), and direct the City Clerk to file the Notice of Completion for the project. Retention on this project shall be disbursed in accordance with California Public Contract Code.

On December 11, 2018, City Council awarded Public Works Construction Project No. 17-007 REBID, Lancaster Boulevard and 15th Street East Roundabout, HSIPL-5419(042). This project provided the construction of a single lane roundabout at the intersection of Lancaster Boulevard and 15th Street East, which included improvement of pavement, concrete, storm drain, street lights, landscaping and irrigation. In addition to the roundabout, road diet improvements (restriping) were installed on 15th Street East from Kettering Street to Avenue J, and on Lancaster Boulevard from Challenger Way to 20th Street East. Curb extensions ("bulb-outs") were constructed on Lancaster Boulevard at 17th Street East.

CC 6. Adopt **Resolution No. 20-17**, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Lancaster, California, confirming the continued existence of a local emergency in the City of Lancaster, California.

On January 30, 2020, the International Health Regulations Emergency Committee of the World Health Organization ("WHO") declared the COVID-19 outbreak a public health emergency of international concern, and subsequently characterized COVID-19 as a pandemic. The United States Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak on January 31, 2020. On March 4, 2020, the Governor of California declared a state of emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak. The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health declared a local and public health emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak on March 4, 2020. The President of the United States declared a national emergency resulting from the COVID-19 outbreak on March 13, 2020. On March 17, 2020, the City Council affirmed and ratified a Proclamation of the existence of a local emergency resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. The State and Los Angeles County Health Officers have issued orders intended to help prevent the spread of COVID-19, including mandating people to stay home except as needed to perform essential services, ordering businesses deemed non-essential to close, and requiring the wearing of face masks. Although some restrictions in these various orders have been relaxed recently, the national and local public health emergency resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic remains in effect, and the virus continues to pose a threat to the health and safety of residents in the City of Lancaster.

CC 7. Adopt **Resolution No. 20- 18**, Re-Adopting Certain Regulatory and Procedural Measures Related to the COVID-19 Local Emergency.

On March 17, 2020, the City Council adopted a number of measures related to the global COVID-19 pandemic. Among these was Resolution No. 20-10, which established protocols addressing a variety of items including the extension of deadlines for non-critical City functions. The proposed resolution reaffirms each of these measures, extending those without a specified duration throughout the duration of the local state of emergency. The resolution also extends the stay on collections for business licenses, issuance of code enforcement administrative citations and parking citations, and all collection activities associated with such citations for an additional 60 days through August 17, 2020. In addition, the proposed resolution introduces a new measure: the Stand Strong & Stay Active Program. Through this program, businesses or individuals who wish to conduct fitness or exercise classes at a City of Lancaster park may do so through park rentals, provided they utilize all mandated social distancing measures. All park facility rental fees would be waived under the program. Stand Strong & Stay Active would remain in place until fitness businesses are permitted to open their facilities by the State of California and the County of Los Angeles. This program aims to help residents stay fit and healthy throughout the duration of the pandemic, while also providing much-needed support to local businesses. Each of these measures will aid the Lancaster community as we continue to strive to "Be Well, Stay Informed, Stand Strong."

CC 8. Purchase and Installation of Playground Equipment and Flooring at Sgt. Steve Owen Memorial Park

- a. In lieu of undertaking its own competitive bidding or proposal process, authorize the City of Lancaster to use (piggyback) the 1Government Procurement Alliance (1GPA) Public Sector Contract with Dave Bang Associates Inc. 1GPA is a nonprofit national governmental purchasing cooperative that helps public agencies take advantage of public contracts.
- b. Award purchase and installation of playground equipment and flooring at Sgt. Steve Owen Memorial Park to Dave Bang Associates Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$900,000.
- c. Approve addition of Capital Improvement Project (CIP) 361-11ZZ007-924, ADA Compliant Playground & Flooring Improvements at Sgt. Steve Owen Memorial Park to the City's Five-Year Capital Improvement Program in the amount of \$900,000; \$700,000 will come from funding in FY 2019-2020 & \$200,000 in FY 2020-2021
- d. Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to sign all documents.

Staff is recommending that Council authorize the City of Lancaster to piggyback on the 1Government Procurement Alliance (1GPA) Public Sector Contract with Dave Bang Associates Inc. 1GPA is a nonprofit national governmental purchasing cooperative that helps public agencies take advantage of public contracts. Use of this contract is in agreement with the City of Lancaster's purchasing practices for achieving the lowest pricing available. It is staff's opinion a competitive bidding process facilitated by the City of Lancaster would not be practicable or advantageous. Under the Purchasing Policy, piggyback contracts with other governmental agencies for professional, scientific, expert, or technical services where contracts were competitively bid are allowed. The proposed award to Dave Bang Associates Inc. will provide for a brand-new playground, including equipment and flooring, at the City's flagship park.

PH 1. Substantial Amendment to the 2019 - 2020 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Action Plan

Recommendation:

- a. Approve the Substantial Amendment to the 2019 2020 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Annual Action Plan
- b. Recognize revenues & approve appropriations in the amount of \$1,090,899; \$874,303 in Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES Act) CDBG-CV Entitlement Funds and \$216,596 in CDBG carry forward funding from prior years. New and existing appropriations will be allocated pursuant to the Substantial Amendment and CARES Entitlement spending plans.
- c. Authorize the City Manager or designee to execute all contracts and associated documents, including subrecipient agreements, subject to City Attorney approval.

In response to a thorough review of the proposed activities, consultation with Housing and Urban Development representatives, recognition of emerging City needs, and the COVID-19 pandemic, the City recognized the need to amend the 2019 - 2020 CDBG Action Plan—to be most responsive and meet community needs. Additionally, part of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) (Public Law 116-136) funding to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) made available supplemental CDBG funding for grants to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus (CDBG-CV grants). By entitlement, the City of Lancaster received a special CDBG-CV allocation in the amount of \$874,303.

NEW BUSINESS

NB 1. Stand Strong Reopening Assistance Program

Recommendations:

- a. Approve the Stand Strong Reopening Assistance Program, designed to provide businesses with the items they need to safely reopen under the guidelines issued by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health and the State of California.
- b. Appropriate \$750,000 from Account No. 101-4431-770, Stand Strong Business Recovery Loan Program to Account No. 101-4240-355, Special Programs to fund the Stand Strong Reopening Assistance Program.

As businesses prepare to reopen under new health and safety guidelines issued by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health and the State of California, they face two challenges: 1) ongoing shortages of PPE, hand sanitizer, and other required items; and 2) increased business costs due to requirements to provide such supplies for all employees and customers, as well as potential costs in adapting their businesses physically to accommodate social distancing. The Stand Strong Reopening Assistance Program ("Stand Strong") will provide for these needs. Our Small Business Recovery Resource team stands ready to guide business owners through the new requirements appropriate to their industry. In addition, qualifying businesses will have the opportunity to apply for reopening assistance through Stand Strong. While the program will focus on items such as PPE, hand sanitizer, and CDC-approved cleaning products, it will have the flexibility to provide additional items needed to reopen that may be specific to a particular business or industry.

NB 2. Grocery Workers Appreciation Program

Recommendations:

- a. Approve the Grocery Workers Appreciation Program, which will provide grocery workers who have served during the pandemic with a bill credit of up to \$50 on their Lancaster Choice Energy bills.
- b. Approve the dismissal of up to \$50,000 in Lancaster Choice Energy charges for qualifying grocery workers under the Grocery Workers Appreciation Program.

Through the proposed program, the City aims to recognize one group of such essential workers who rarely receive the limelight: grocery workers. In recognition of the sacrifices they continue to make for our community, Lancaster Choice Energy (LCE) has created a program which will provide eligible grocery workers who are LCE customers with a one-time credit on their LCE charges.

Recommendation:

Adopt **Resolution HA No. 1-20**, a resolution of the Lancaster Housing Authority (the "Housing Authority") approving a disposition strategy for the sale of single-family residences.

Fiscal Impact:

Revenue from the sale of the homes will be approximately \$675,000, minus closing cost, and will be deposited into the Lancaster Housing Authority, account number 306-3606-100.

Background:

On August 14, 2007, the Agency Board approved the implementation of the Neighborhood Foreclosure Preservation Home Ownership Program (the "Program") citywide. The goal of the Program is to reclaim vacant, abandoned properties for affordable housing, to strengthen blocks and neighborhoods by eliminating the blighting effects of vacant properties, and enforce the city codes and city building code requirements. The Program is designed to preserve sustainable homeownership for Lancaster residents by reclaiming foreclosed homes as neighborhood assets. The owner-occupied housing will be for qualifying low- or moderate-income families. Such units will be subject to occupancy and affordability restrictions recorded against the property as required by Health & Safety Code 33334.2(e)(2).

On January 24, 2012 the Lancaster City Council, adopted Resolution 12-08 assigning the housing functions of the former Lancaster Redevelopment Agency to the Lancaster Housing Authority and making certain findings in connection therewith.

The Lancaster Housing Authority purchased and rehabilitated three properties. These properties will be marketed and sold to potential homeowners who agree to purchase each property for appraised value and agree to the recording of affordability Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions. The Affordability Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions contain affordability requirements and restrict the resale of the property to be owner occupied for forty-five years. The properties will be listed and sold through the Greater Antelope Valley Association of Realtors members, via the local area Multiple Listing Service to qualified homebuyers.

One significant component of the removal of blight and revitalization of mature neighborhoods is the rehabilitation of older housing stock. During the economic downturn, there has been a substantial number of foreclosures on mortgages throughout the City. The City has purchased and rehabilitated several vacant and foreclosed properties. The homes purchased are typically those in need of the most assistance and not purchased by homeowners or investors when listed on the local Multiple Listing Service. The properties have been rehabilitated with energy efficient features, such as dual pane windows, Energy Star appliances, and drought tolerant landscaping, in an effort to reduce the maintenance cost of the home to the new homeowners.

Rehabilitation of older properties by the Lancaster Housing Authority helps to eliminate blight in the neighborhoods, and it assists the community by providing much needed affordable homeownership for families. Sale of the rehabilitated properties to homeowners will also help provide a better balance of homeowner to investor in the neighborhoods. By encouraging homeownership, the value attributed to the land as a resource increases, as the conditions of physical deterioration and blight due to poor use of the property, squatting and illegal dumping have been removed. The rejuvenation of these properties is further bolstered with the real potential of providing long-term affordable homeownership.

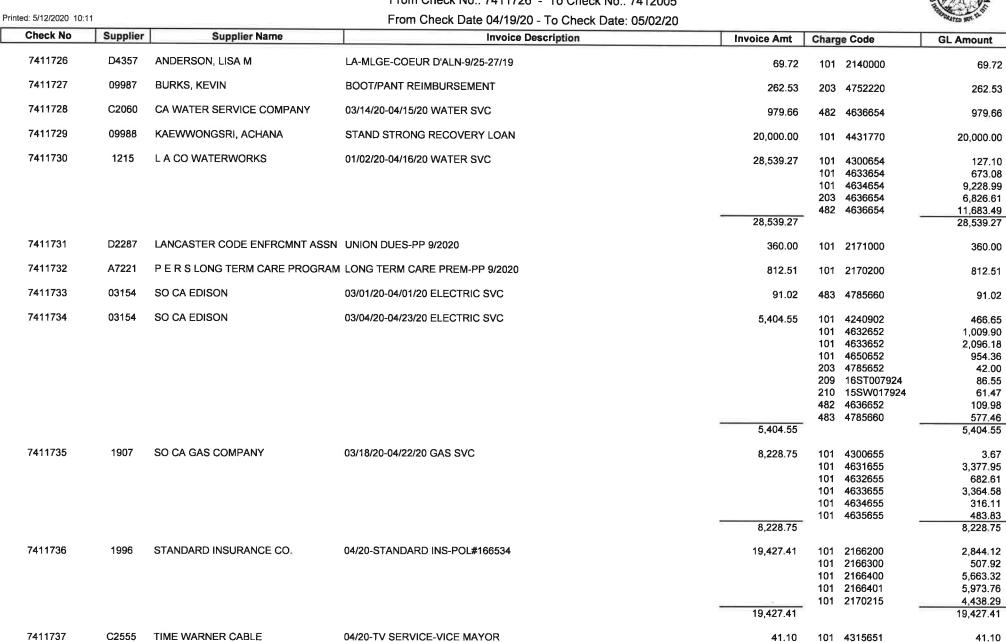

2020 Thermoplastic Striping Refresh Program

Recommendation:

Award Public Works Construction Project No. 20-004, 2020 Thermoplastic Striping Refresh Program to Cal Stripe Inc., of Colton, California, in the amount of \$275,999.00 plus additive alternate locations in the amount of \$62,168.65 and a 20% contingency, to refresh fading, long line striping along various roadway segments throughout the City (totaling about 30 roadway miles). Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to sign all documents. This contract is awarded to the lowest responsible bidder per California Public Code Section 22038 (b).

Fiscal Impact:

\$405,801.18 (including additive alternate locations and a 20% contingency) to be awarded; sufficient funds are available in Capital Improvements Budget Account Numbers 210-15ST078-924 and 206-15ST078-924. There is no annual cost for maintenance since this project is maintenance only.

Background:

The proposed project is a maintenance effort to refresh approximately 30 roadway miles of long line striping throughout the City. Thermoplastic traffic paint will be used, because it lasts much longer than the alternative and is more visible to the driver, creating safer roadways in the City. Locations were prioritized based on age of existing striping and traffic volumes.

This project is funded with Measure R and TDA article 8 funds.

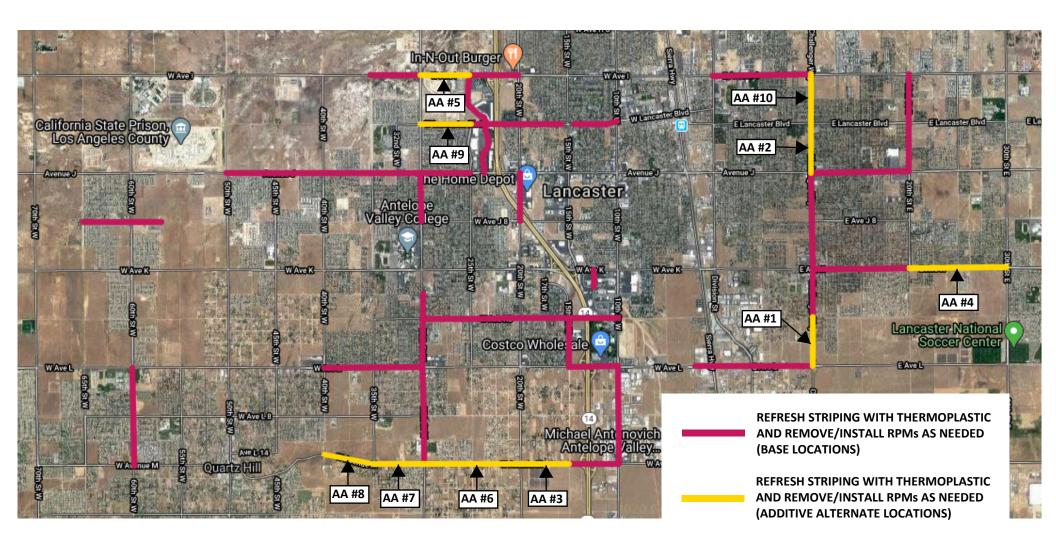

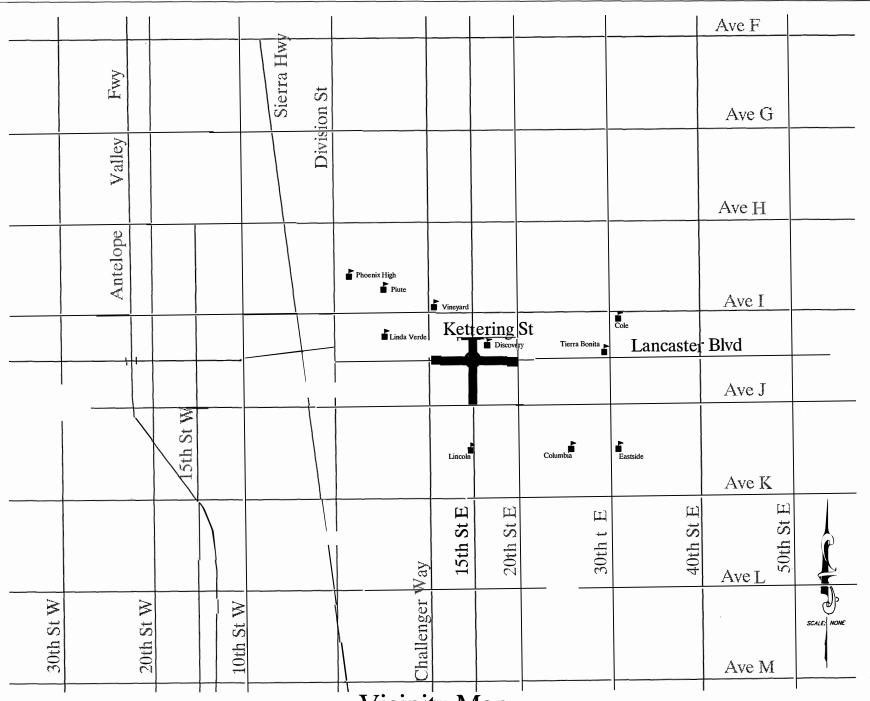
On December 11, 2018, City Council awarded Public Works Construction Project No. 17-007 REBID, Lancaster Boulevard and 15th Street East Roundabout, HSIPL-5419(042). This project provided the construction of a single lane roundabout at the intersection of Lancaster Boulevard and 15th Street East, which included improvement of pavement, concrete, storm drain, street lights, landscaping and irrigation. In addition to the roundabout, road diet improvements (restriping) were installed on 15th Street East from Kettering Street to Avenue J, and on Lancaster Boulevard from Challenger Way to 20th Street East. Curb extensions ("bulb-outs") were constructed on Lancaster Boulevard at 17th Street East.

Subject: Resolution Confirming the Continued Existence of a Local Emergency

Recommendation:

Adopt **Resolution No. 20-17**, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Lancaster, California, confirming the continued existence of a local emergency in the City of Lancaster, California.

Fiscal Impact:

Staff will return to Council with future revenue, expense, or cost reimbursement appropriations recommendations.

Background:

On January 30, 2020, the International Health Regulations Emergency Committee of the World Health Organization ("WHO") declared the COVID-19 outbreak a public health emergency of international concern, and subsequently characterized COVID-19 as a pandemic. The United States Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak on January 31, 2020. On March 4, 2020, the Governor of California declared a state of emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak. The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health declared a local and public health emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak on March 4, 2020. The President of the United States declared a national emergency resulting from the COVID-19 outbreak on March 13, 2020.

On March 17, 2020, the City Council affirmed and ratified a Proclamation of the existence of a local emergency resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic.

The State and Los Angeles County Health Officers have issued orders intended to help prevent the spread of COVID-19, including mandating people to stay home except as needed to perform essential services, ordering businesses deemed non-essential to close, and requiring the wearing of face masks. Although some restrictions in these various orders have been relaxed recently, the national and local public health emergency resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic remains in effect, and the virus continues to pose a threat to the health and safety of residents in the City of Lancaster.

Staff recommends that City Council adopt Resolution No. 20-17 to confirm the continued existence of the local emergency, as required by the California Emergency Services Act (the "Act," set forth at Cal. Gov't. Code §§8550-8668), and, in accordance with the Act, to regularly review the need for continuing the local emergency.

Recommendations:

Adopt **Resolution No. 20-17** Re-Adopting Certain Regulatory and Procedural Measures Related to the COVID-19 Local Emergency.

Fiscal Impact:

None.

Background:

On March 17, 2020, the City Council adopted a number of measures related to the global COVID-19 pandemic. Among these was Resolution No. 20-10, which established protocols addressing a variety of items including the extension of deadlines for non-critical City functions. These include:

- Deadlines for non-critical City functions extended by 30 calendar days for the duration of the emergency
- All City classes, courses, and sports at City facilities and other City events serving more than 10 people cancelled for the duration of the emergency
- A 90-day stay on the payment of application fees for all new or renewed business licenses
- A 90-day stay on the issuance of code enforcement administrative citations and parking citations, and all collection activities associated with such citations (with the exception of citations related to public health and safety issues)
- Limitation of meetings to 10 or fewer people
- Authorization of the reprioritization of FY 2019-2020 Community Development Block Grant funding to respond to COVID-19
- Directed grocery stores to set aside two (2) hours each day during which access to the store is limited to persons 60 years of age and older
- Directed local to waive any per-household limits on food items, cleaning goods and sanitary supplies for service providers who serve community members in need
- Established COVID-19 screening protocols for group homes, senior residential and day care facilities, and other group living facilities

The proposed resolution reaffirms each of these measures, extending those without a specified duration throughout the duration of the local state of emergency. The resolution also extends the stay on collections for business licenses, issuance of code enforcement administrative citations and parking citations, and all collection activities associated with such citations for an additional 60 days through August 17, 2020.

In addition, the proposed resolution introduces a new measure: the Stand Strong & Stay Active Program. Through this program, businesses or individuals who wish to conduct fitness or exercise classes at a City of Lancaster park may do so through park rentals, provided they utilize all mandated social distancing measures. All park facility rental fees would be waived under the program. Stand Strong & Stay Active would remain in place until fitness businesses are permitted to open their facilities by the State of California and the County of Los Angeles. This program aims to help residents stay fit and healthy throughout the duration of the pandemic, while also providing much-needed support to local businesses.

Each of these measures will aid the Lancaster community as we continue to strive to "Be Well, Stay Informed, Stand Strong."

Grant (CDBG) Action Plan

Recommendations:

- a. Approve the Substantial Amendment to the 2019 2020 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Annual Action Plan
- b. Recognize revenues & approve appropriations in the amount of \$1,090,899; \$874,303 in Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES Act) CDBG-CV Entitlement Funds and \$216,596 in CDBG carry forward funding from prior years. New and existing appropriations will be allocated pursuant to the Substantial Amendment and CARES Entitlement spending plans.
- c. Authorize the City Manager or designee to execute all contracts and associated documents, including subrecipient agreements, subject to City Attorney approval.

Fiscal Impact:

There is no impact to the City's General Fund. The above actions will increase the City's total CDBG funding and appropriations to \$3,058,821 for Fiscal Year 2019-2020. The appropriations will be allocated pursuant to the Substantial Amendment and CARES Entitlement spending plans.

Background:

On April 23, 2019, the City Council approved the 2019 - 2020 Community Development Block Grant One-Year Action Plan, which provided a summary of proposed program activities the City would undertake and the funding levels for the 2019 CDBG Program year. The funds were a combination of 2019 - 2020 CDBG Entitlement and Reprogrammed Funding.

In response to a thorough review of the proposed activities, consultation with Housing and Urban Development representatives, recognition of emerging City needs, and the COVID-19 pandemic, the City recognized the need to amend the 2019 - 2020 CDBG Action Plan—to be most responsive and meet community needs.

Additionally, part of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) (Public Law 116-136) funding to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) made available supplemental CDBG funding for grants to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus (CDBG-CV grants). By entitlement, the City of Lancaster received a special CDBG-CV allocation in the amount of \$874,303.

Pursuant to 24 CFR 91.505(a), proposed changes (activities and funding) are considered a Substantial Amendment to the 2019 - 2020 Annual Action Plan and require specific citizen participation actions, including a Public Hearing, before the changes may be approved by the City Council and submitted to HUD.

In addition to the supplemental CDBG-CV allocation, a memorandum was released by HUD regarding CARES Act Flexibilities for CDBG Funds Used to Support Coronavirus Response and Plan Amendment Waiver. The memorandum also transmitted a Guide describing the immediate availability of a 5-day public comment period for amendments and new plan submissions, as well as other flexibilities, by way of a Waiver. The City of Lancaster submitted an official Waiver request, as of April 22, 2020, to allow the City the flexibility to immediately utilize its funds to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and to facilitate assistance to Lancaster households impacted by COVID-19.

Notice of the Public Hearing concerning the proposed Substantial Amendment was published in the Antelope Valley press and posted on the City's website, and at City Hall on May 20, 2020.

As such staff recommends amending the 2019 - 2020 Community Block Grant Action Plan as noted in the Substantial Amendment No. 1. The proposed projects are consistent with the 2015 - 2020 Consolidated Plan goals and will provide immediate assistance to the Lancaster community.

The City of Lancaster must adopt and adhere to a Citizen Participation Plan to receive federal funds for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. II PURPOSE OF THE CITIZEN PARTICIPATION PLAN

This Citizen Participation Plan sets forth the policies and procedures for citizen participation in Lancaster's consolidated planning process. The Administrative and Community Services (ACS) Department, as the lead agency for the Consolidated Plan, is responsible for the citizen participation process.

The Citizen Participation Plan encourages citizens to participate in the consolidated planning process from the beginning. It outlines the procedures for community approval of the Consolidated Plan, for addressing concerns, objections and complaints, and for making amendments to the Plan after approval.

III STANDARDS OF CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

The City of Lancaster shall provide a process of citizen participation at the community-wide level with regard to the overall preparation of the Consolidated Plan and its annual funding programs. The City of Lancaster recognizes and appreciates the value of citizen input for community development planning.

- All aspects of citizen participation shall be conducted in an open manner with freedom of access for all interested persons.
- The City shall make reasonable efforts to ensure the involvement of low-, very low-, and extremely low-income persons, members of minority groups, residents of areas where a significant amount of activity is proposed or ongoing, the elderly, the disabled, the business community, and civic groups who are concerned about the program.
- The City shall make reasonable efforts to ensure continuity of involvement of citizens or citizen organizations throughout all stages of the Consolidated Plan process.
- Citizens shall be provided adequate and timely information to enable them to be meaningfully involved in important decisions at all stages of the program.
- Citizens shall be encouraged to submit their views and comments regarding the Consolidated Plan and its funding programs.

IV ENCOURAGEMENT OF CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

The City shall encourage and provide for citizen participation in all phases of the Consolidated Plan process including any amendments to the Plan and the annual performance report process. Although the City will encourage participation from all facets of the community, including minorities and non-English speaking persons, as well as persons with physical impairments, emphasis will be placed on the involvement of low-, very-low, and extremely low-income residents where housing and community development funds may be spent.

V CITIZEN PARTICIPATION OPPORTUNITIES

The City of Lancaster and the ACS Department urges citizens to voice their concerns and share their ideas concerning its federal programming. It welcomes comments and suggestions regarding the Citizen Participation Plan, the Consolidated Plan (including the

Annual Action Plan), and the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER).

To encourage citizen participation, the ACS Department will undertake the following activities each year.

- Hold at least two public meetings at different times during the development of the Consolidated Plan and Strategy to garner citizen comments on needs, strategies, actions, and projects.
- Offer at least 30-day comment periods on the draft versions of the City of Lancaster's Consolidated Plan and Strategy, each Annual Action Plan, and any substantial amendments to the Consolidated Plan or Action Plan.
- Offer at least a 15-day comment period on the Consolidated Annual Evaluation and Performance Report prior to submitting the final report to HUD.
- Post both draft and final versions of the City of Lancaster's Consolidated Plan and Strategy, Annual Action Plan, CAPER and any substantial amendments to the Consolidated Plan or Action Plan on the City's internet site.

VI <u>PUBLIC MEETINGS AND PUBLIC HEARINGS</u>

Public meetings and public hearings regarding the consolidated plan process are held to address housing and community development needs and development of proposed activities; to obtain citizen input; and to respond to citizen recommendations and questions in these and other areas related to the plan process. At least two public meetings will be held at different times during the development of the Consolidated Plan and Strategy document. At least one public hearing will be held during each program year which begins on July 1 of each year to receive citizen input and to respond to citizen recommendations and questions related to the consolidated plan process prior to approval of the Consolidated Plan and Strategy Annual Action Plan documents.

Notice of all public hearings shall be published at least 30 days prior to the time of the hearing and shall include times, dates, locations and the topics to be discussed at the hearing.

Public hearings will be held at Lancaster City Hall which is centrally located in the community and accessible to the physically disabled. Public hearings will be held at times convenient to the general public and to the potential and/or actual beneficiaries of the federally-funded programs.

In the event that a significant number of non-English speaking residents can be reasonably expected to attend and participate in a public hearing or public meeting or the

City has been notified in advance that non-English speaking residents will be attending a public meeting or public hearing, the City will exercise best efforts to provide translation services for those residents. The City has staff members fluent in Spanish who are able to provide translation services. If services are required for other languages, the City will exercise best efforts to secure a translator from private sources.

To provide full access to programs under the Consolidated Plan for persons with disabilities, the City staff will select only sites for public meetings and public hearings that are accessible for persons with physical disabilities and conduct outreach to community organizations that represent persons with disabilities as part of the Consolidated Plan process.

VII PUBLIC COMMENTS

Citizens are encouraged to submit views, proposals, and comments concerning the preparation of the final Consolidated Plan, Annual Action Plans, amendments to the Plan, and performance and evaluation reports in writing or orally at formal public hearings. The City will provide written responses to any submitted written proposals and/or comments relating to any portion of the Consolidated Plan process within 15 working days of receipt of the proposals and/or comments when practicable. If a response cannot be completed within 15 working days, due to a lack of final determination concerning the issue, the City will provide a progress report and estimate of when final determination can be expected.

Proposals and comments received during the consolidated plan process will be reviewed by the appropriate staff members and, where considered pertinent, will be submitted with recommendations to the City Council for determination during the public hearing on the final Plan document. A summary of these comments and views and a summary of any comments or views not accepted, and the reasons therefor, shall be attached to the final Consolidated Plan (including the Annual Action Plan), substantial amendment to the Consolidated Plan, Citizen Participation Plan, or Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER).

VIII PUBLIC INFORMATION AND ACCESS TO RECORDS

Citizens, public agencies, and other interested parties may review information and records relating to the Consolidated Plan. The City will provide full and timely public access to HUD programs under the Consolidated Plan including the following documents that the CDBG Administrator maintains on file consistent with applicable state and local laws regarding personal privacy and obligations of confidentiality:

- Federal Laws: Summary of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1977; Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended; the National Affordable Hosing Act, as amended.
- Federal Regulations: CDBG Program regulations and related issuances and provisions (i.e. Uniform Relocation Assistance) including Title 24 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 570 Community Development Block Grants and Title 24 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 42 Consolidated Submission for Community Planning and Development Programs
- Consolidated Plans, Annual Action Plans, Citizen Participation Plan, and Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Reports
- U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) information: grant agreements, audit records, evaluation reports, approval letters, and other related correspondence
- Public meeting records: public meetings, informal meetings with civic and neighborhood groups, and related notifications pertaining to programs under the Consolidated Plan process

Documents relevant to the CDBG program shall be made available at the City Clerk Office located at City Hall during normal working hours for citizen review upon either a written or oral request. Documents are available for public review from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Friday at Lancaster City Hall, 44933 Fern Avenue, Lancaster, CA 93534.

To locate records and arrange space for viewing, the CDBG Coordinator requests written notice at least three days prior to review. Review of records that are more than two years old will require a seven-day notice. Requests for multiple copies of the same documents may be subject to a per-page copying charge that will not exceed the copying charge to the City and may require additional time to process.

IX <u>CITIZEN PARTICIPATION PLAN COORDINATOR</u>

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Administrator also coordinates citizen participation and consultation. The administrator's responsibilities include the following activities relative to citizen participation:

- 1. Organizing public hearings and meetings as well as scheduling meetings with neighborhood and civic groups when appropriate.
- 2. Recording and responding to all written comments and complaints regarding activities funded through the Consolidated Plan.

- 3. Ensuring distribution of citizen comments and complaints to the appropriate City staff.
- 4. Ensuring compliance with the Citizen Participation Plan and all applicable federal regulations regarding citizen participation.

X <u>TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE</u>

Upon request, the City will provide technical assistance to organizations that wish to develop proposals for funding assistance under any programs covered by the Consolidated Plan. The City of Lancaster especially encourages groups representative of extremely low- to moderate-income persons to request technical assistance. The City will determine the level and type of technical assistance on a case-by-case basis.

Additionally, the City welcomes and encourages continuous dialogue with citizens and community groups to encourage participation, especially to those citizens affected by Community Development Block Grant activities. City staff will be available to speak to any interested community group to explain the consolidated plan process and any funding programs covered by the Plan. Technical assistance may be obtained by contacting the City's Consolidated Plan staff at (661) 723-6243.

XI <u>COMPLAINTS</u>

The City will provide a written response to every formal written citizen complaint or substantive objection related to the Citizen Participation Plan, the Consolidated Plan (including the Annual Action Plan), Substantial Amendments to the Consolidated Plan, and the CAPER within 15 working days. A formal written complaint or substantive objection regarding the previous mentioned documents or activities should be forwarded to the City of Lancaster City Clerk Department, 44933 Fern Avenue, Lancaster, CA 93534.

Such substantive objections must address the following issues (specified in HUD regulations):

- The City's description of needs and objectives in its Consolidated Plan is plainly inconsistent with available facts and data.
- The City's proposed activities are plainly inappropriate to meeting the needs and objections identified by the City.
- The City's application does not comply with HUD requirements regulating programs under the Consolidated Plan or other applicable laws.

• The City's application proposes activities that are otherwise ineligible as specified in applicable HUD regulations.

A summary of citizen comments and complaints and summary of any comments not accepted (and the reasons why the complaint was not accepted) will be attached to the final Consolidated Plan Annual Action Plan, CAPER, or Substantial Amendment.

XII AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSOLIDATED PLAN

The Consolidated Plan regulations (§91.505) require the City of Lancaster to amend its approved Consolidated Plan whenever it makes one of the following decisions:

- 1. To change allocation priorities or change the method of distributing CDBG funds
- 2. To carry out an activity, using CDBG funds (including program income), not previously described in the Annual Action Plan
- 3. To change the purpose, scope, location, or beneficiaries of an activity previously approved in the Annual Action Plan

When the City decides to make a substantive change which requires the Consolidated Plan or Annual Action Plan to be amended, it shall publish a notice of the change and provide a reasonable opportunity for citizens to comment on the proposed amendment. The City will make the amendment public and will notify HUD that the City made an amendment. The City will ensure that all amendments are contained in the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report submitted to HUD.

The City reserves the right to make non-substantive changes to the Consolidated Plan without opening a public comment period.

XIII <u>CRITERIA FOR SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT</u>

The Consolidated Plan regulations consider certain amendments to be *substantial amendments* that require a public comment period and additional citizen participation. The City of Lancaster defines a *substantial amendment* as:

• Changes in the use of CDBG funds from one eligible activity to another (§91.105(c)(1)). Budget increases or decreases, independent of any other changes, do not constitute a substantial amendment

The City of Lancaster also defines a substantial amendment as:

- Any reduction of funds for an approved activity where the original objective can no longer be met.
- Any new activity not previously included in the Consolidated Plan Annual Action Plan
- A monetary change which exceeds 25% of the total amount funded for a particular project.

If the City should need to make a substantial amendment to its approved Consolidated Annual Plan, the City will follow the same citizen participation process described for the Annual Action Plan, including a 30-day public comment period, a public hearing, and a notice placed in a local newspaper informing the public of the proposed substantial amendment.

In finalizing the substantial amendment, the City will consider any written or verbal citizen comments received at the public hearing. It will attach a summary of these comments (including a summary of any comments not accepted and the reasons it did not accept them) to the substantial amendment. Please see Section XI, "Complaints," of this Citizen Participation Plan for information about where to send comments.

XIV SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT PROCESS FOR COVID-19 RESPONSE

Needs Assessment Overview

The needs previously identified in this Consolidated Plan focused on housing, homelessness prevention and response, public services, public facilities and infrastructure. The COVID-19 pandemic has only exacerbated needs already existing in Lancaster. However, some needs have been reprioritized.

The ongoing shut-down of businesses has resulted in record unemployment, which severely impacts the low-and moderate-income households, especially those already living below the poverty level and those with severe housing cost burden.

As a result of shortages in some areas, combined with loss of income for many households, there has been substantial increase in demand for assistance through public services, especially food

banks, meal delivery services, and healthcare-related services. The rapid increase in demand has left many service providers under-staffed and under-resourced and has added substantial cost. The increased demand is expected to be sustained beyond the shutdown as households will take time to regain employment and economic stability.

Homelessness response and homelessness prevention has also risen in priority. Many households have been unable to pay rent since the shut-down and shelter-in-place orders were issued in early March 2020. While there are moratoriums on evictions, housing costs are still a major concern, particularly for lower income households who may be at risk of homelessness once the moratorium is lifted. Homelessness prevention must be a community priority to prevent increase in homelessness as housing protections are lifted.

Persons already experiencing homelessness are also at increased risk of infection and death due to COVID-19. Congregate shelters are not a viable housing solution in a pandemic, and persons experiencing homelessness need access to safe shelter to prevent infection and spread of the disease.

Public facilities that support healthcare or that provide safe housing for persons experiencing homelessness also are prioritized. Both temporary and permanent capacity-building for healthcare and homeless facilities are priorities as well.

The 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan (AP) is being amended to incorporate additional funding in the initial phase (FY 2019-2020) of HUD's CARES Act resource distribution plan.

The City of Lancaster also proposes to take the unexpended balance(s) remaining from the approved Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) projects / activities from previous program years along with amendment and/or deletion of programs / activities previously described in the 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan and redistribute the funds to approved CDBG programs / activities as well as new CDBG programs / activities.

Pursuant to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regulations and the City of Lancaster Citizen Participation Plan, these changes are considered a "Substantial Amendment) to the 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan that require specific citizen participation actions before the change may be approved by the City Council and submitted to HUD. To allow interested residents the opportunity to review and comment on the proposed changes, the City published a public notice on the City of Lancaster website May 20,2020 informing residents of the availability of the Substantial Amendment document for public review and comment for a period of 5 days from May 20, 2020 to May 26, 2020. The public review and comment period concludes with a public hearing before the City Council on May 26, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. when the City Council will consider the amendment.

This amendment is necessary to reallocate unexpended CDBG funds from the previously-approved programs / activities in the amount of \$704,304.04 and \$1,823.00 in program income to amend and/or delete previously-approved programs / activities (PY 19/20).

Subject: Stand Strong Reopening Assistance Program

Recommendations:

- a. Approve the Stand Strong Reopening Assistance Program, designed to provide businesses with the items they need to safely reopen under the guidelines issued by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health and the State of California.
- b. Appropriate \$750,000 from Account No. 101-4431-770, Stand Strong Business Recovery Loan Program to Account No. 101-4240-355, Special Programs to fund the Stand Strong Reopening Assistance Program.

Fiscal Impact:

\$750,000 will be reallocated from the Stand Strong Business Recovery Loan Program to the Stand Strong Reopening Assistance Program.

Background:

As businesses prepare to reopen under new health and safety guidelines issued by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health and the State of California, they face two challenges: 1) ongoing shortages of PPE, hand sanitizer, and other required items; and 2) increased business costs due to requirements to provide such supplies for all employees and customers, as well as potential costs in adapting their businesses physically to accommodate social distancing. Most small business owners have never had a need to source supplies such as face masks before, and certainly not during a nationwide shortage that has increased prices and made locating such items exceedingly difficult.

The Stand Strong Reopening Assistance Program ("Stand Strong") will provide for these needs. Our Small Business Recovery Resource team stands ready to guide business owners through the new requirements appropriate to their industry. In addition, qualifying businesses will have the opportunity to apply for reopening assistance through Stand Strong. With a simple, streamlined application, businesses will be able to request the supplies they need to reopen as quickly as possible. The City will provide these items as appropriate, free of charge. While the program will focus on items such as PPE, hand sanitizer, and CDC-approved cleaning products, it will have the flexibility to provide additional items needed to reopen that may be specific to a particular business or industry.

To qualify for Stand Strong, a business must:

- Be an independent, locally-owned small business whose primary business operation is located within the Lancaster City limits
- Have annual gross revenue of \$3.5 million or less

\$750,000 presently allocated to the Stand Strong Business Recovery Loan Program will be reallocated to the Reopening Assistance Program. Approximately \$500,000 in loans have been awarded to date, leaving an additional \$750,000 remaining in the loan program.

Through this program, the City of Lancaster will save businesses time and money, allowing them to reopen quickly and efficiently once permitted to do so and put their employees back to work. In addition, the City will help protect the health of our residents by providing sanitization supplies as we work to safely reopen our community.

If approved, the program is slated to launch June 8.

Lancaster Choice Energy revenues will be reduced by up to \$50,000.

Background:

The City of Lancaster deeply appreciates the countless frontline and essential workers who have contributed to our community throughout the course of COVID-19. Their tireless efforts have helped our community slow the spread, reducing infections and saving lives.

Through the proposed program, the City aims to recognize one group of such essential workers who rarely receive the limelight: grocery workers.

Grocery workers likely never expected their career choice to place them on the front lines of a global pandemic, yet that is precisely where they find themselves today. Throughout the course of a shift, they may be exposed to hundreds upon hundreds of people, all with the potential to expose them and their families to COVID-19. Yet they continue to work to allow everyone in our community to feed their families, and in order to feed their own.

In recognition of the sacrifices they continue to make for our community, Lancaster Choice Energy (LCE) has created a program which will provide eligible grocery workers who are LCE customers with a one-time credit on their LCE charges. To be eligible, a customer must submit an application, including proof of employment at a grocery store at any time since the state of emergency was declared on March 17, 2020. They will receive a bill credit for all Lancaster Choice Energy charges on their electric bill for that month, up to \$50.

The program will allocate \$50,000 in bill credits, allowing for a minimum of 1,000 local workers to receive the benefit. The program will run from June 15 through August 31, 2020, or until funds are exhausted. As summer months typically represent the highest usage, this timing will allow grocery workers to receive the greatest benefit under the program.

The program will include workers at any grocery store, defined as a retail place that primarily sells food either fresh or preserved, and essential non-food items. This includes traditional grocery-focused stores such as Vons, Aldi, and Vallarta; locally-owned independent stores such as Ben's Corner, Remy's Oriental Market, and La Bodega Meat Market; and stores that also sell a wide variety of non-food items, such as Walmart, Target, and Costco.

If the program is approved, grocery workers interested in participating in the program can visit <u>LancasterChoiceEnergy.com</u> beginning June 15 to apply.
