CC 4. Acceptance of Public Works Construction Project No. 18-007 – 2018 Parks and Concrete Repairs

Recommendation:

Accept Public Works Construction Project No. 18-007, 2018 Parks and Concrete Repairs, by R.C. Becker and Son, Inc., of Santa Clarita, California. Retention on this project shall be disbursed in accordance with California Public Contract Code.

On October 8, 2019, the City Council awarded Public Works Construction Project No. 18-007, 2018 Parks Concrete Repairs. The City of Lancaster approved an agreement for the design and construction of a new skatepark at Jane Reynolds Park, which is located at 716 West Oldfield Street. Under the 2018 Parks Concrete Repair project, the City improved pedestrian access, American with Disabilities Act (ADA) upgrades, and the overall aesthetics to the area surrounding the proposed skatepark. The project included removing and replacing nearly 39,280

square feet (SF) of sidewalk, constructing 3,000 SF of new sidewalk, upgrading eight (8) curb ramps to meet ADA standards, improving 1,200 SF of existing driveways, root pruning, and tree trimming 6 trees. Construction took place concurrently with the skatepark construction, minimizing the disruption to residents living in the area and to those who frequent the park.

CC 5. First Amendment to Community Workforce Agreement

Recommendation:

Approve Amendment No. 1 to the Community Workforce Agreement between the City of Lancaster and Los Angeles/Orange Counties Building and Construction Trades Council and the signatory local unions and district councils. Authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute all related documents.

The agreement provides that, for applicable projects, the City will contract exclusively with contractors who agree to comply with the terms of the agreement. Non-union contractors may continue to bid on, and be awarded, contracts for applicable City projects subject to the terms of the agreement. Under the original agreement, applicable projects are limited to multi-trade contracts that exceed \$175,000 and prime specialty contracts that exceed \$100,000, with several exemptions (including work performed by City employees, design teams, and other City consultants not performing manual labor; non-construction support services; and work that has been deemed immediately required as a result of a local emergency). As these types of projects are already subject to prevailing wage, entering into this agreement did not cause an increase in project costs. The proposed amendment to this agreement would expand the scope of applicable projects to include projects built by, with, or for the City where the City has a "Proprietary Interest" in a project. This includes projects for which the City provides a cash payment, tax credit, loan, or where the City transfers an asset of value for less than fair market price that exceeds \$1,000,000.

The proposed Ordinance adds Chapter 2.39 to the Lancaster Municipal Code to establish the Lancaster Social Justice Commission. The Lancaster Social Justice Commission will consist of seven Commissioners of Change and up to three alternates whose purpose shall be to cultivate and sustain diversity and inclusion through accountability and civilian oversight by fostering a fair and equitable justice system with transparency in all forms of government in the City of Lancaster.

The City is committed to strong community partnerships, safe neighborhoods and parks, quality services to support residents, and respectful and responsive city employees to make the City a strong, caring and safe community for all residents. The City has been proactive in its actions to protect residents during the COVID-19 pandemic, to safely reopen businesses and partner with local employers to ensure a strong economic recovery, serving as a model for other cities in Los Angeles County. Like the rest of the State and the country, the City faces serious fiscal challenges due to the fallout of the COVID-19 pandemic with funding for high-priority services threatened as a result. The City currently expects an alarming decrease in revenues that will severely limit its ability to provide these essential City services and has already taken or is considering various cost-saving measures, including implementing hiring and salary freezes for existing employees, reduced operating budgets, capital outlay and a workforce reduction by the elimination of vacant positions. Despite such expenditure reductions, the City's General Fund revenues are expected to decrease by \$9.9 million in Fiscal Year 2020-21 and another \$8.8 million in Fiscal Year 2021-22 due to steep declines in sales tax, property tax, and state funding revenues. Additional locally controlled funding is necessary to protect essential city services and keep our community strong, healthy and safe into the future.

Each month, the Finance Department prepares a report listing the investments for all separate entities under the jurisdiction of the City as identified in the City's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report.

The portfolio balance increased from May to June by \$21,078,822 or 26.9%. Significant revenues for June included \$16,400,968 Property Taxes, \$8,057,160 TDA Article 8, \$1,543,223 Sales and Use Tax and \$1,450,082 LA County MTA Grants, and \$406,974 Proposition A & C.

The largest City expenditures were \$2,659,032 Payroll & Benefits related, \$2,268,671 LA County Sheriff for April 2020 law enforcement services, and \$2,058,508 for Capital Projects The City's temporary idle cash, those funds that are not immediately needed to pay current bills and not governed by bond indentures or bond resolutions, is invested in accordance with the City's adopted Investment Policy. This policy is reviewed regularly by the City Council, with the latest policy adopted February 13, 2018, by Resolution No. 18-06.

The City's cash management system is designed to accurately monitor and forecast expenditures and revenues, thus enabling the City to invest funds to the fullest extent possible within the guidelines of this Investment Policy. The City attempts to achieve the highest yield obtainable through a diversified portfolio only after meeting the criteria established for safety and liquidity in that order. The principal investment objectives of the City are:

- 1. Preservation of capital and protection of investment principal;
- 2. Maintenance of sufficient liquidity to meet anticipated cash flows;
- 3. Attainment of a market rate of return;
- 4. Diversification to avoid incurring unreasonable market risks, and;
- 5. Compliance with the City's Municipal Code and with all applicable City resolutions, California statutes and Federal regulations.

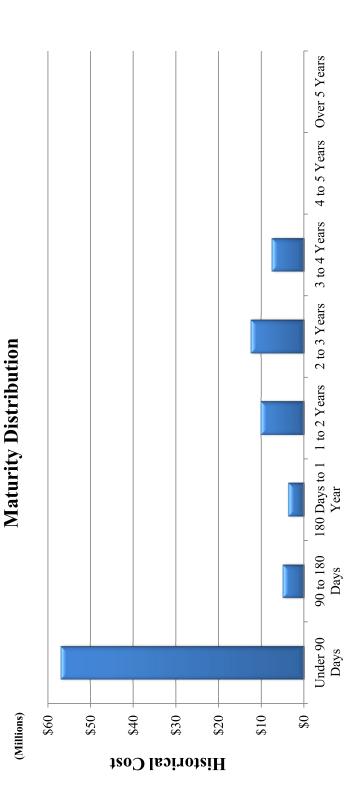

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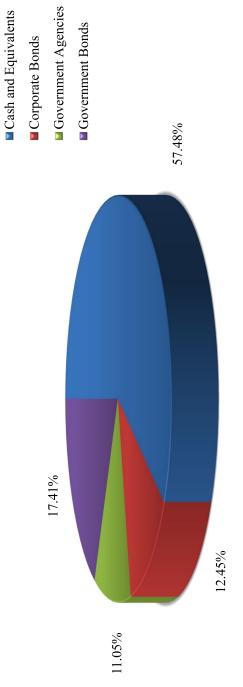

Recommendation:

Accept Public Works Construction Project No. 18-007, 2018 Parks and Concrete Repairs, by R.C. Becker and Son, Inc., of Santa Clarita, California. Retention on this project shall be disbursed in accordance with California Public Contract Code.

Fiscal Impact:

\$676,853.90 (including 10% contingency) was awarded based on the original contract. There were three (3) Contract Change Orders totaling \$104,469.68 that have brought the total contract cost to \$510,852.05. Sufficient funds were available in Capital Improvements Budget Account Numbers 227-12GS006-924, 229-12GS006-924 and 206-12GS006-924. There are no associated annual maintenance costs.

Background:

On October 8, 2019, the City Council awarded Public Works Construction Project No. 18-007, 2018 Parks Concrete Repairs. The City of Lancaster approved an agreement for the design and construction of a new skatepark at Jane Reynolds Park, which is located at 716 West Oldfield Street. Under the 2018 Parks Concrete Repair project, the City improved pedestrian access, American with Disabilities Act (ADA) upgrades, and the overall aesthetics to the area surrounding the proposed skatepark. The project included removing and replacing nearly 39,280 square feet (SF) of sidewalk, constructing 3,000 SF of new sidewalk, upgrading eight (8) curb ramps to meet ADA standards, improving 1,200 SF of existing driveways, root pruning, and tree trimming 6 trees. Construction took place concurrently with the skatepark construction, minimizing the disruption to residents living in the area and to those who frequent the park.

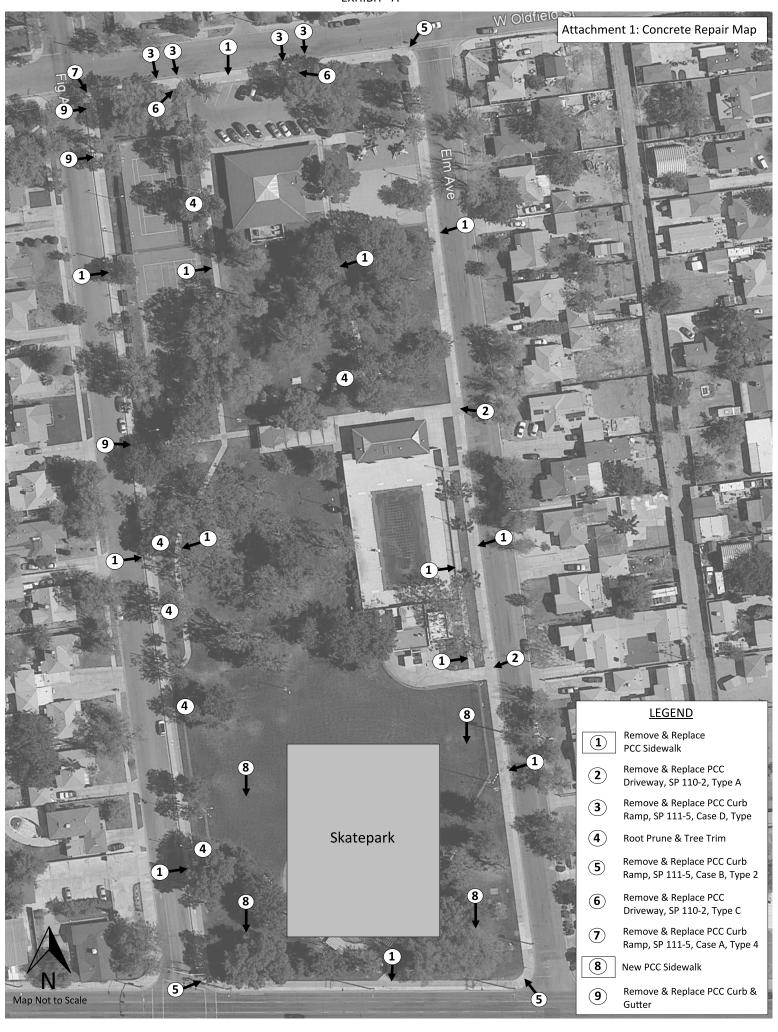

Subject: First Amendment to Community Workforce Agreement

Recommendation:

Approve Amendment No. 1 to the Community Workforce Agreement between the City of Lancaster and Los Angeles/Orange Counties Building and Construction Trades Council and the signatory local unions and district councils. Authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute all related documents.

Fiscal Impact:

None.

Background:

In January 2018, the City Council approved a Community Workforce Agreement (CWA) between the City of Lancaster and Los Angeles/Orange Counties Building and Construction Trades Council and the signatory local unions and district councils. This agreement established the labor relations policies and procedures for the City and the craft employees represented by unions engaged in work on certain City improvement projects.

The agreement provides that, for applicable projects, the City will contract exclusively with contractors who agree to comply with the terms of the agreement. Non-union contractors may continue to bid on, and be awarded, contracts for applicable City projects subject to the terms of the agreement.

Under the original agreement, applicable projects are limited to multi-trade contracts that exceed \$175,000 and prime specialty contracts that exceed \$100,000, with several exemptions (including work performed by City employees, design teams, and other City consultants not performing manual labor; non-construction support services; and work that has been deemed immediately required as a result of a local emergency). As these types of projects are already

subject to prevailing wage, entering into this agreement did not cause an increase in project costs.

The proposed amendment to this agreement would expand the scope of applicable projects to include projects built by, with, or for the City where the City has a "Proprietary Interest" in a project. This includes projects for which the City provides a cash payment, tax credit, loan, or where the City transfers an asset of value for less than fair market price that exceeds \$1,000,000.

Additionally, the City regularly receives funding for various projects from federal agencies, some of which prohibit the use of geographic-based hiring preferences. In such scenarios, the geographic hiring preference component of the CWA would not apply to the corresponding federally funded work.

The initial CWA and the proposed amendment aim to help provide stable, well-paying jobs to area residents. As Lancaster continues to navigate the economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, such jobs in the essential construction industry are of even greater importance to our community.

THIS AMENDMENT NO.	1 to the Community Workforce Agreement ("Amendment") is

(collectively "Unions") and	the City of Lancaster ("City") (collectively "Parties").

RECITALS:

- A. On ______, 2018, the Parties entered into that certain Community Workforce Agreement ("Existing CWA").
- B. Section 2.2 of the Existing CWA provides that the work covered by this Agreement is defined and limited to:
- (a) All construction and rehabilitation work pursuant to prime multi-trade contracts that exceed \$175,000.00 and all subcontracts arising from these prime contracts; and
- (b) All prime specialty contracts that exceed \$100,000.00, and all subcontracts arising from these specialty contracts;
- (c) It is understood by the Parties that the City may at any time, and at its sole discretion, add additional projects under this Agreement not set forth in subsections (a) and (b), above.
- C. The Parties desire to include, as additional work to be covered by the Existing CWA, certain additional construction work in which the City has a propriety interest.
- D. City and the Unions desire to amend the Existing PLA as set forth in this Amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed by and between the Parties as follows:

AGREEMENT:

- 1. Section 2.2 of the Existing CWA is hereby amended by adding the following new subsection (d) as follows:
 - (d) Work covered by this Agreement shall also include projects built by, with or for the City where the City has a "Proprietary Interest" in a project. For the purposes of this Article, Proprietary Interest means: Where the City provides a cash payment, tax credit, loan or where the City transfers an asset of value for less than fair market price for the project site or project to be developed that exceeds one-million dollars.
- 2. New subsection (b) is hereby added to Section 2.7 as follows:
 - (b) Should the City receive funding or assistance from any federal agency that prohibits the use of a geographic-based hiring preferences, then such geographic-

based hiring preferences, as set forth in Sections 3.5, 3.6, 3.8 and 12.1 in this Agreement, shall not apply to the work funded by such federal source.

3. Section 3.11 is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

Section 3.11 Union Membership No employee covered by this Agreement shall be required to join any Union as a condition of being employed, or remaining employed, for the completion of Project Work; provided, however, that any employee who is a member of the referring Union at the time of referral shall maintain that membership in good standing while employed under this Agreement.

4. Except as expressly amended by this Amendment, the Existing CWA remains in full force and effect as originally executed.

Recommendation:

Introduce **Ordinance No. 1075,** adding Chapter 2.39 to the Lancaster Municipal Code creating the Lancaster Social Justice Commission.

Fiscal Impact:

None.

Background:

The proposed Ordinance adds Chapter 2.39 to the Lancaster Municipal Code to establish the Lancaster Social Justice Commission. The Lancaster Social Justice Commission will consist of seven Commissioners of Change and up to three alternates whose purpose shall be to cultivate and sustain diversity and inclusion through accountability and civilian oversight by fostering a fair and equitable justice system with transparency in all forms of government in the City of Lancaster.

The Lancaster Social Justice Commission will be appointed by the Mayor and ratified through a vote of the City Council. Commissioners will act in an advisory capacity to the City Council, City Manager, and the County Sheriff's Department on matters regarding diversity and inclusion.

At the July 14, 2020 City Council Meeting, Social Justice and Social Equity Goals, which the Lancaster Social Justice Commission will work to move forward, were discussed. The Commission's Social Justice Goals will include increasing civic engagement, increasing public transparency and working closely with the Sheriff's Department, ensuring credibility and transparency in those investigations that end in a civil rights violation or deputy involved death, the creation of a community task force, the promotion of transparency through subpoena power, and working to remove barriers for re-entry for people with challenging backgrounds.

Social Equity Goals were also shared including the creation of programs with guaranteed job placement for students, the creation of financial literacy programs for high school and college students in Lancaster, the development of grants to support jobs and entrepreneurship and working with the City to increase the availability of mentorship and afterschool programs for young people in Lancaster.

ORDINANCE NO. 1075

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LANCASTER, CALIFORNIA, ADDING CHAPTER 2.38 TO LANCASTER MUNICIPAL CODE CREATING THE LANCASTER SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lancaster ("City Council") has determined that it is in the public interest to create the Lancaster Social Justice Commission as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Lancaster Social Justice Commission shall be to cultivate and sustain diversity and inclusion through accountability and civilian oversight by fostering a fair and equitable justice system with transparency in all forms of government in the City of Lancaster.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LANCASTER, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Council finds and determines that the above recitals are true and correct and incorporates the recitals herein by this reference.
- Section 2. Chapter 2.39 ("Lancaster Social Justice Commission") is hereby added to the Lancaster Municipal Code to read as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- Section 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance, including Exhibit "A", is held for any reason to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases or portions be declared invalid or unconstitutional.
- Section 4. All ordinances or resolutions, or provisions of the Lancaster Municipal Code, or parts thereof, that are inconsistent with this Ordinance, are hereby repealed only to the extent of their inconsistency; provided, however, that such repeal shall not be construed to revive any ordinance or resolution, or part thereof.
- Section 5. The Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause the same to be published and posted pursuant to the provisions of

Sections:
Creation and Purpose. Membership. Term of Office. Chairman and Vice-Chairman. Vacancy. Removal. Attendance. Meetings. Expenses.
Creation and Purpose. There is created a Social Justice Commission for the city with the purpose of acting in an advisory capacity to the City Council, City Manager, and the County Sheriff's Department to cultivate and sustain diversity and inclusion through accountability and civilian oversight by fostering a fair and equitable justice system with transparency in all forms of government in the City of Lancaster.
Membership. The Social Justice Commission shall be composed of seven (7) Commissioners and up to three (3) alternates, all of whom shall be residents of the City of Lancaster or residents of the Antelope Valley who work within the city limits of the City of Lancaster. All Commissioners and alternates of the Social Justice Commission shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to approval of a majority of the City Council. An alternate may replace any Commissioner who is absent from a meeting or abstains from a matter due to an actual or potential conflict of interest.
Term of Office The term of each Commissioner and alternate shall be one (1) year commencing on January 1 of each year and ending on the following December 31. Notwithstanding said term, a Commissioner or alternate shall serve until a successor has been appointed. A Commissioner or alternate may be reappointed for additional terms. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter, all Commissioners and alternates serve at the pleasure of the mayor and city council.
Chairman and Vice-Chairman. The Mayor shall appoint one of the Commissioners of the Lancaster Social Justice Commission as Chairman to preside over the Commission's meetings and another Commissioner to serve as Vice-Chairman, to preside in the absence of the Chairman.
Vacancy. Any vacancy occurring on the Lancaster Social Justice Commission shall be filled by an appointment made by the Mayor, subject to approval of a majority of the City Council. Any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall serve for the remainder of the term of the Commissioner or alternate whose office has been vacated.

Removal.
Whenever, in the opinion of the Mayor or upon a vote of a majority of the City Council,
the best interests of the City shall be served thereby, any Commissioner or alternate of the Social
Justice Commission may be removed from office by a majority vote of the City Council.
Attendance.
If a Commissioner is absent without cause from three (3) regular meetings of the Social
Justice Commission during any calendar year, the Mayor, subject to approval of a majority of the
City Council, may deem said Commissioner's appointment immediately terminated, and may fill
the vacancy in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

Adopt **Resolution No. 20-40** (the "Election Resolution"), calling for the holding of a Special Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, for the submission to the voters a proposed measure relating to an ordinance enacting a transactions and use tax to be administered by the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration.
- b. Adopt **Resolution No. 20-41** (the "Consolidation Resolution"), requesting the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles to consolidate a Special Municipal Election to be held on November 3, 2020, with the Statewide General Election to be held on that date pursuant to Section 10403 of the Elections Code.

Fiscal Impact:

The estimated cost of holding a consolidated Special Municipal Election on November 3, 2020, for the submission to the voters a proposed measure relating to an ordinance enacting a transactions and use tax to be administered by the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration is \$______, which will be funded with [describe funding source]. If approved, the proposed transactions and use tax is estimated to generate \$12,000,000 in annual revenue. If the transactions and use tax is not approved, City services must be reduced in order for the City to operate with a balanced budget.

Background:

The City is committed to strong community partnerships, safe neighborhoods and parks, quality services to support residents, and respectful and responsive city employees to make the City a strong, caring and safe community for all residents. The City has been proactive in its actions to protect residents during the COVID-19 pandemic, to safely reopen businesses and partner with local employers to ensure a strong economic recovery, serving as a model for other cities in Los Angeles County.

Like the rest of the State and the country, the City faces serious fiscal challenges due to the fallout of the COVID-19 pandemic with funding for high-priority services threatened as a result. The City currently expects an alarming decrease in revenues that will severely limit its ability to provide these essential City services and has already taken or is considering various cost-saving measures, including implementing hiring and salary freezes for existing employees, reduced operating budgets, capital outlay and a workforce reduction by the elimination of vacant positions. Despite such expenditure reductions, the City's General Fund revenues are expected to decrease by \$9.9 million in Fiscal Year 2020-21 and another \$8.8 million in Fiscal Year 2021-22 due to steep declines in sales tax, property tax, and state funding revenues. Additional locally controlled funding is necessary to protect essential city services and keep our community strong, healthy and safe into the future.

On July 14, 2020, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 20-37, which ordered that an ordinance be submitted to the voters at a municipal election to be held on November 3, 2020, approving enacting a transactions and use tax to be administered by the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration.

The resolutions currently under consideration implement Resolution No. 20-37 by doing the following:

Election Resolution: The Election Resolution (a) calls and orders to be held in the City of Lancaster, on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, a Special Municipal Election for the purpose of submitting the proposed ordinance to the voters, as required by Resolution No. 20-37, (b) clarifies that such election will be a Special (not General) Municipal Election, and (c) provides for administration of and payment for such election. The Election Resolution also reaffirms the existence of an emergency for purposes of Section 2(b) of Article XIII C of the California Constitution.

<u>Consolidation Resolution</u>: The Consolidation Resolution requests that the County of Los Angeles consolidate the Special Municipal Election called by the Election Resolution with the Statewide General Election and provides for administration of and payment for the consolidated Special Municipal Election.

- SECTION 8. <u>General</u>. In all particulars not recited in this resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LANCASTER DO HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. The above recitals are true, correct and constitute a substantive part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. <u>Amendment of Municipal Code.</u>

- (a) Chapter 3.14 ("Transactions and Use Tax") is hereby added to the Lancaster Municipal Code to read as set forth in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- (b) The people of the City of Lancaster desire enhanced transparency and public participation regarding the tax imposed by this Ordinance, and expect the revenues and expenditures from the tax to be regularly reviewed by a Citizen's Advisory Committee. Therefore, the Lancaster Municipal Code is further amended by adding Section 3.14.170 to read as follows:
 - **"3.14.170 Oversight**. Following adoption of this Ordinance by the voters, the City Council shall appoint a five-member Citizen's Advisory Committee. The City Council shall, by resolution, adopt guidelines for the duties of the Citizen's Advisory Committee which shall include, but not be limited to, receiving semi-annual reports from City staff each fiscal year on revenues and expenditures from the tax imposed by this Ordinance and review of proposed spending plans. The revenue from the sales tax shall not be spent by the City until after the Citizen's Advisory Committee has had an opportunity to review and comment on proposed expenditures."
- **Section 4** Severability. If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase added by this Ordinance, or any part thereof, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of effectiveness of the remaining portions of this ordinance or any part thereof. The people of the City of Lancaster hereby declares that they would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases are declared unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective.
- **Section 5.** Election Required. This Ordinance shall not become effective unless and a until it is approved by a majority of City voters at the General Municipal Election to be held November 3, 2020.

3.14.010 Title.

This chapter shall be known as the Lancaster Transactions and Use Tax Ordinance. As used in this chapter, the term "City" means the City of Lancaster. This chapter shall be applicable within the incorporated territory of the City.

3.14.020 Operative Date.

As used in this chapter, the term "Operative Date" means the first day of the first calendar quarter commencing more than 110 days after the adoption of the ordinance adding this chapter.

3.14.030 Purpose.

The purpose of this chapter is to achieve the following, among other purposes, and this chapter shall be interpreted and applied to accomplish such purposes:

- A. To impose a retail transactions and use tax in accordance with the provisions of Part 1.6 (commencing with Section 7251) of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code and Section 7285.9 of Part 1.7 of Division 2 which authorizes the City to adopt this tax ordinance which shall be operative if a majority of the electors voting on the measure vote to approve the imposition of the tax at an election called for that purpose.
- B. To adopt a retail transactions and use tax ordinance that incorporates provisions identical to those of the Sales and Use Tax Law of the State of California insofar as those

provisions are not inconsistent with the requirements and limitations contained in Part 1.6 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code.

- C. To adopt a retail transactions and use tax ordinance that imposes a tax and provides a measure therefore that can be administered and collected by the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration in a manner that adapts itself as fully as practicable to, and requires the least possible deviation from, the existing statutory and administrative procedures followed by the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration in administering and collecting the California State Sales and Use Taxes.
- D. To adopt a retail transactions and use tax ordinance that can be administered in a manner that will be, to the greatest degree possible, consistent with the provisions of Part 1.6 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, minimize the cost of collecting the transactions and use taxes, and at the same time, minimize the burden of record keeping upon persons subject to taxation under the provisions of this ordinance.

3.14.040 Contract with State.

Prior to the Operative Date, the City shall contract with the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration to perform all functions incident to the administration and operation of this chapter; provided, that if the City shall not have contracted with the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration prior to the Operative Date, it shall nevertheless so contract and in such a case the Operative Date shall be the first day of the first calendar quarter following the execution of such a contract.

3.14.050 Transactions Tax Rate.

For the privilege of selling tangible personal property at retail, a tax is hereby imposed upon all retailers in the incorporated territory of the City at the rate of $\frac{3}{4}$ of a cent per dollar (0.75%) of the gross receipts of any retailer from the sale of all tangible personal property sold at retail in said territory on and after the Operative Date of this chapter.

3.14.060 Place of Sale.

For the purposes of this chapter, all retail sales are consummated at the place of business of the retailer unless the tangible personal property sold is delivered by the retailer or his agent to an out-of-state destination or to a common carrier for delivery to an out-of-state destination. The gross receipts from such sales shall include delivery charges, when such charges are subject to the state sales and use tax, regardless of the place to which delivery is made. In the event a retailer has no permanent place of business in the State or has more than one place of business, the place or places at which the retail sales are consummated shall be determined under rules and regulations to be prescribed and adopted by the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration.

3.14.070 Use Tax Rate.

An excise tax is hereby imposed on the storage, use or other consumption in the City of tangible personal property purchased from any retailer on and after the operative date of this ordinance for storage, use or other consumption in said territory at the rate of ¾ of a cent per dollar (0.75%) of the sales price of the property. The sales price shall include delivery charges when such charges are subject to state sales or use tax regardless of the place to which delivery is made.

3.14.080 Adoption of the Provisions of State Law.

Except as otherwise provided in this chapter and except insofar as they are inconsistent with the provisions of Part 1.6 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, all of the provisions of Part 1 (commencing with Section 6001) of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code are hereby adopted and made a part of this ordinance as though fully set forth herein.

3.14.090 Limitations on Adoption of State Law and Collection of Use Taxes.

In adopting the provisions of Part 1 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code:

- A. Wherever the State of California is named or referred to as the taxing agency, the name of this City shall be substituted therefor. However, the substitution shall not be made when:
- 1. The word "State" is used as a part of the title of the State Controller, State Treasurer, State Treasury, or the Constitution of the State of California;
- 2. The result of that substitution would require action to be taken by or against this City or any agency, officer, or employee thereof rather than by or against the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration, in performing the functions incident to the administration or operation of this Ordinance.
- 3. In those sections, including, but not necessarily limited to sections referring to the exterior boundaries of the State of California, where the result of the substitution would be to:
- a. Provide an exemption from this tax with respect to certain sales, storage, use or other consumption of tangible personal property which would not otherwise be exempt from this tax while such sales, storage, use or other consumption remain subject to tax by the State under the provisions of Part 1 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, or;
- b. Impose this tax with respect to certain sales, storage, use or other consumption of tangible personal property which would not be subject to tax by the state under the said provision of that code.
- 4. In Sections 6701, 6702 (except in the last sentence thereof), 6711, 6715, 6737, 6797 or 6828 of the Revenue and Taxation Code.
- B. The word "City" shall be substituted for the word "State" in the phrase "retailer engaged in business in this State" in Section 6203 and in the definition of that phrase in Section 6203.

3.14.100 Permit Not Required.

If a seller's permit has been issued to a retailer under Section 6067 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, an additional transactor's permit shall not be required by this chapter.

3.14.110 Exemptions and Exclusions.

A. There shall be excluded from the measure of the transactions tax and the use tax the amount of any sales tax or use tax imposed by the State of California or by any city, city and

county, or county pursuant to the Bradley-Burns Uniform Local Sales and Use Tax Law or the amount of any state-administered transactions or use tax.

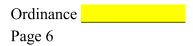
- B. There are exempted from the computation of the amount of transactions tax the gross receipts from:
- 1. Sales of tangible personal property, other than fuel or petroleum products, to operators of aircraft to be used or consumed principally outside the county in which the sale is made and directly and exclusively in the use of such aircraft as common carriers of persons or property under the authority of the laws of this State, the United States, or any foreign government.
- 2. Sales of property to be used outside the City which is shipped to a point outside the City, pursuant to the contract of sale, by delivery to such point by the retailer or his agent, or by delivery by the retailer to a carrier for shipment to a consignee at such point. For the purposes of this paragraph, delivery to a point outside the City shall be satisfied:
- a. With respect to vehicles (other than commercial vehicles) subject to registration pursuant to Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 4000) of Division 3 of the Vehicle Code, aircraft licensed in compliance with Section 21411 of the Public Utilities Code, and undocumented vessels registered under Division 3.5 (commencing with Section 9840) of the Vehicle Code by registration to an out-of-City address and by a declaration under penalty of perjury, signed by the buyer, stating that such address is, in fact, his or her principal place of residence; and
- b. With respect to commercial vehicles, by registration to a place of business out-of-City and declaration under penalty of perjury, signed by the buyer, that the vehicle will be operated from that address.
- 3. The sale of tangible personal property if the seller is obligated to furnish the property for a fixed price pursuant to a contract entered into prior to the operative date of this chapter.
- 4. A lease of tangible personal property which is a continuing sale of such property, for any period of time for which the lessor is obligated to lease the property for an amount fixed by the lease prior to the operative date of this chapter.
- 5. For the purposes of subparagraphs (3) and (4) of this section, the sale or lease of tangible personal property shall be deemed not to be obligated pursuant to a contract or lease for any period of time for which any party to the contract or lease has the unconditional right to terminate the contract or lease upon notice, whether or not such right is exercised.
- C. There are exempted from the use tax imposed by this chapter, the storage, use or other consumption in this City of tangible personal property:
- 1. The gross receipts from the sale of which have been subject to a transactions tax under any state-administered transactions and use tax ordinance.

- 2. Other than fuel or petroleum products purchased by operators of aircraft and used or consumed by such operators directly and exclusively in the use of such aircraft as common carriers of persons or property for hire or compensation under a certificate of public convenience and necessity issued pursuant to the laws of this State, the United States, or any foreign government. This exemption is in addition to the exemptions provided in Sections 6366 and 6366.1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code of the State of California.
- 3. If the purchaser is obligated to purchase the property for a fixed price pursuant to a contract entered into prior to the operative date of this chapter.
- 4. If the possession of, or the exercise of any right or power over, the tangible personal property arises under a lease which is a continuing purchase of such property for any period of time for which the lessee is obligated to lease the property for an amount fixed by a lease prior to the operative date of this chapter.
- 5. For the purposes of subparagraphs (3) and (4) of this section, storage, use, or other consumption, or possession of, or exercise of any right or power over, tangible personal property shall be deemed not to be obligated pursuant to a contract or lease for any period of time for which any party to the contract or lease has the unconditional right to terminate the contract or lease upon notice, whether or not such right is exercised.
- 6. Except as provided in subparagraph (7), a retailer engaged in business in the City shall not be required to collect use tax from the purchaser of tangible personal property, unless the retailer ships or delivers the property into the City or participates within the City in making the sale of the property, including, but not limited to, soliciting or receiving the order, either directly or indirectly, at a place of business of the retailer in the City or through any representative, agent, canvasser, solicitor, subsidiary, or person in the City under the authority of the retailer.
- 7. "A retailer engaged in business in the City" shall also include any retailer of any of the following: vehicles subject to registration pursuant to Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 4000) of Division 3 of the Vehicle Code; aircraft licensed in compliance with Section 21411 of the Public Utilities Code; and/or undocumented vessels registered under Division 3.5 (commencing with Section 9840) of the Vehicle Code. Such retailer shall be required to collect use tax from any purchaser who registers or licenses the vehicle, vessel, or aircraft at an address in the City.
- D. Any person subject to use tax under this Chapter may credit against that tax any transactions tax or reimbursement for transactions tax paid to a district imposing, or retailer liable for a transactions tax pursuant to Part 1.6 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code with respect to the sale to the person of the property the storage, use or other consumption of which is subject to the use tax.

3.14.120 Amendments to State Law.

All amendments subsequent to the effective date of this chapter to Part 1 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code relating to sales and use taxes and which are not inconsistent with Part 1.6 and Part 1.7 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, and all amendments to Part



1.6 and Part 1.7 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, shall automatically become a part of this chapter, provided however, that no such amendment shall operate so as to affect the rate of tax imposed by this chapter.

3.14.130 Enjoining Collection Forbidden.

No injunction or writ of mandate or other legal or equitable process shall issue in any suit, action or proceeding in any court against the State or the City, or against any officer of the State or the City, to prevent or enjoin the collection under this ordinance, or Part 1.6 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, of any tax or any amount of tax required to be collected.

3.14.140 Severability.

If any provision of this chapter or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this chapter and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

3.14.150 Effective Date.

This chapter relates to the levying and collecting of the City transactions and use taxes and shall take effect immediately.

3.14.160 Termination Date.

The authority to levy the tax imposed by this ordinance shall not expire unless terminated by lawful vote of the electorate or as required or authorized by law.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LANCASTER, CALIFORNIA, REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES TO CONSOLIDATE A SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020, WITH THE STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THAT DATE PURSUANT TO SECTION 10403 OF THE ELECTIONS CODE

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lancaster called a Special Municipal Election to be held on November 3, 2020, for the purpose of submitting to the voters a proposed measure relating to an ordinance enacting a transactions and use tax to be administered by the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the Special Municipal Election be consolidated with the Statewide General Election to be held on the same date and that within the city the precincts, polling places and election officers of the two elections be the same, and that the county election department of the County of Los Angeles canvass the returns of the Special Municipal Election and that the election be held in all respects as if there were only one election;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LANCASTER, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the requirements of Section 10403 of the Elections Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles ("County") is hereby requested to consent and agree to the consolidation of a Special Municipal Election with the Statewide General Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, for the purpose of submitting to the voters a proposed measure relating to an ordinance enacting a transactions and use tax to be administered by the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration.

SECTION 2. A measure is to appear on the ballot as follows:

SECTION 3. The proposed complete text of the measure (ordinance) to be submitted to the voters is attached as part of Exhibit "A" to Resolution No. 20-39.

SECTION 4. The vote requirement for the measure to pass is a majority of the votes cast.

SECTION 5. The County election department is authorized to canvass the returns of the Special Municipal Election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only election, and only one form of ballot shall be used. The election will be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of Section 10418 of the Elections Code and law regulating the statewide election.

SECTION 6. The Board of Supervisors is requested to issue instructions to the County election department to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the consolidated election.

SECTION 7. The City Council authorizes the City Clerk to administer said election and all reasonable and actual election expenses shall be paid by the City upon presentation of a properly submitted bill.

SECTION 8. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the Board of Supervisors and the County election department.

SECTION 9. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.
