CC 9. APPROVE AN INCREASE IN THE CONTRACT AMOUNT FOR COHEN VENTURES, INC. DBA ENERGY SOLUTIONS FOR DEVELOPMENT OF THE LANCASTER COMMUNITY SOLAR PROGRAM

Approved an increase in the contract amount for Cohen Ventures, Inc. DBA Energy Solutions (Energy Solutions), by \$25,000.00 for the development of the Lancaster Community Solar Program and authorized the City Manager to sign all documents.

Awarded RFP 752-22, Lancaster Performing Arts Center (LPAC) Lighting Improvements, to L.V.H. Entertainment Systems, of Moorpark, California, in the amount of \$1,019,328.16 to provide new L.E.D. lighting units to the Lancaster Performing Arts Center (LPAC). Authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute and transmit all necessary contracts and associated documents, including the Substantial Amendment to the Consolidated Plan and Action Plans, and any additional amendments, to ensure the City's timely expenditure of CDBG and HOME funds.
