NEW PUBLIC HEARINGS

2. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. 22-10

Planner, Kendall Brekke, presented the staff report. Staff recommends the adoption of Resolution No. 23-01 approving Conditional Use Permit No. 22-10 to allow for the conversion of an existing Community Care Facility, to a Residential Health Facility within an existing building in the R-7,000 zone located at 1603 Roywood Drive (APN 3148-047-010). The applicant was available for questions.

Chairman Vose inquired about the difference between a Community Care Facility and Residential Health Facility. Commissioner Derryberry inquired about appropriate licensing.

3. <u>VEHICLE MILES TRAVELED (VMT) IMPACT FEE MITIGATION PROGRAM</u>

Senior Planner, Jocelyn Swain, presented the staff report. Staff recommends adopting Resolution No. 23-02, recommending to the City Council approval of an ordinance amending Title 15 (Buildings and Construction) of the Lancaster Municipal Code by adding Chapter 15.67 relating to the

Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) Impact Fee Mitigation Program and recommending certification of the Final Program Environmental Impact Report and adoption of the Findings and Statement of Overriding Considerations.

We had three public speakers for this agenda item, all from the Carpenter's Local Union 661; Nicolas Reyes, Crispin Carrasco, and Shaun Mieure. All three gentleman were in support of the VMT Impact Fee Mitigation Program and asked that the City and developers consider using skilled and unionized carpenters or labor towards their development endeavors.
