

RFP 836-25 E-Waste Transportation & Recycling

Questions & Answers:

1. Will the City provide current or past rates of compensation and charges for e-waste categories?

No.

2. Will the City disclose their current provider?

No.

3. Does the City Facility have loading docks, or would a lift gate be necessary?

A liftgate will not be necessary, the City has a forklift.

4. Will the provide City past totals per period or multiple years on the weight of e-waste categories from trucks, 40-yard containers and collection events?

Yes, past yearly numbers can be provided upon request.

5. Is the City looking for reimbursement or expecting an income from any of these categories? If so, please specify which material the City is expecting revenue from.

Yes, the City is expecting revenue from revenue generating materials collected.

6. Does the City have an official list of E-Waste material, Labor, Transportation, Containers & Events Pricing Form that they want contracts to fill out, that way pricing can be compared side by side along with other competing contactors?

Yes, Cell Phones, Ballasts, Car Batteries (lead acid), Computers, CRT, Flat Panel TVs, Flat Panel Monitors, Hard Drives, Laptops, Rear Projection TVs, Tablets, Mixed Metals, Peripherals, Printers/Scanners/Fax, Solar Panels, Battery disposal, Solid Waste Disposal, and Toner/ink Cartridge disposal are the majority of the items received. A more comprehensive list can be provided upon request.

7. Is the City asking for free Special Events to be performed by contractor year-round at no cost, or is the contractor allowed to indicate a charge to the City for that service?

The city would ask that be performed at no cost. But the City has not had a special event in a few years where the E-waste contractor was needed.

8. For the e-waste, would the material be on pallets, or would the City expect the Contractor to package loose material?

Corrugated cubic yard boxes and pallets are expected to be provided to the City. Only large items will be loose (ie: fax machines, big screen tvs, etc.)

9. Will the transportation be a combination of loading pallets on trucks and collection of 40-yard containers?

Transportation as of now is done by loading cubic yard boxes on to pallets and placed into a semi-trailer.

10. Will the City consider an alternative to 40-yard containers of metal bins for e-waste and TVs? Large CRTs could be placed on pallets or in metal cages to prevent any hazardous glass from breaking in the roll off bins.

Yes, alternatives will be considered.

11. Would there be any bulky equipment to pickup that would not fit or be placed on pallets, such as Medical Equipment, Refrigerators, Stoves, Washing Machines, Copiers, Solar Panels?

Yes, the City currently receives copiers, fax machines, large screen TV's, and other bulky items.

12. Would Prevailing Wage or Living Wage apply to the Contractor on this Bid?

No.

13. Will the City apply for and provide the contractor with a Proof of Designation document from CalRecycle for the SB20 CRT and TV material collected from the public residents?

Yes, a POD will be submitted to Calrecycle

14. It states the Vendor will be required to complete a Cal Recycle 198 form per load. Will the City provide the vendor with appropriate information of individuals that they have collected CRTs and TVs from in accordance with each pickup?

Calrecycle states that individual information for each item dropped off is not necessary since a POD will be filed. The only item required for the form 198 will be the POD.

15. If the City does not provide the proper information of individuals needed for the Cal Recycle 198 form, how would the vendor reflect any appropriate charges the CRTs/ TVs that are not in compliance with the CalRecycle program?

See question 14 above please.

16. Is the City asking for only one 40-yard container to be stationed year-round and swapped for pickups? If not, how many 40-yard containers can the City's facility hold?

Currently the City is not using any 40-yard roll offs, if transportation is done this way a 40 yard roll off would need to be on site year-round and swapped for pickups.

17. Ideally, approximately how many 40-yard containers does the City's facility accumulate before requesting a pickup? Would this something that can be worked on depending on space and the Vendor's capability?

The City right now loads one 53-foot trailer with cubic yard boxes twice a month on average.

18. Will materials such as Ink, Toner, Batteries, Household batteries, lightbulbs and lamps be materials that will be sent to the contractor?

Yes, these items do find their way into the stream, the City tries to avoid this but some do slip by.

19. How many collection events does the City plan to hold per calendar year?

None, as we are open year-round Tuesday thru Saturday, excluding holidays.

20. Will the City be willing to review and sign the contractors service agreement in addition to the awarded contract agreement, resulting in a mutual indemnity clause for both the contractor and City?

The contractor's service agreement can be submitted for review by the City's attorney; however, execution of the agreement will be based on the City attorney's recommendations.

21. May the city specify the insurance requirements for the use of subcontractors for only the transportation of trucks and transportation of 40-yard containers/metal cages to the contractor's facility?

The insurance requirements for sub-contractors will be the same as those required of the contractor.
