CHANGE ORDERS FOR PWCP NO. 576 SEWER EXTENSION CC 23. Approved Change Orders 1 through 3, and increased the total amount of the contract with Security Paving Company for **Public Works Construction Project No. 576,** Trunk 'B' Sewer Extension, by \$167,125 for a total revised contract amount of \$1,295,810 for changes required that were discovered during construction.

FUNDS GRANTED BY CIWMB CC 24.

Approved the utilization of funds granted by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) for FY 2005/2006 Targeted Rubberized Asphalt Concrete Incentive Grant Program and authorized the Public Works Director and designees to execute and accept the terms, conditions, and certifications of the Grant Agreement TRI-05-1.

COST SHARING AGREEMENT WITH COUNTY OF LA FOR ROADWAY AND STRIPING IMPROVEMENTS CC 25. Approved the cost sharing agreement with the County of Los Angeles to construct roadway and striping improvements and to install a new traffic signal system at Avenue M and 20th Street West. Authorized reimbursement to the County for 50% of the actual costs incurred.

APPROPRIATION OF GRANT FUNDING FROM SCCCA CC 26. Approved the appropriation of grant funding (\$1,000.00) from the Southern California City Clerks Association (SCCCA) to Account No. 101-4110-251 (Records Management Account.)

APPEAL OF CUP NO. 05-15 AND TTM NO. 061555 PH 1. The Planning Director presented the staff report and brief history regarding an appeal of a Planning Commission Approval of Conditional Use Permit No. 05-15 and Tentative Tract Map No. 061555. Additionally, the Planning Director stated that staff is looking over the long term of the likely need of adding traffic signal controls at the intersection of 40th St. West and Avenue M. committing to installing those controls. Early on in the conditions, a concern was raised as to whether or not as a result of those re-designs there is going to be some loss of area that is currently devoted to a particular lot. It is staff's feeling that the original number of lots that were approved in the Tentative Tract Map can still be achieved in the re-design of the map. From staff's perspective, the City's costs in terms of paying for the re-design of that map would not include a whole scale revising of the street system. It is the City's intent that if the applicant's engineer can in fact make some adjustments to the lot widths around some of the existing streets that the City would be willing to bear those costs. If the applicant is able to achieve the same number of lots, he certainly is able to do that under what the City is proposing. It is not staff's intention that the re-design of this would need to go back to the Planning Commission because the basic overall layout of the map does not change significantly and instead, the revised map in accordance with the conditions would be approved at staff level.

Council Comments and concerns: traffic signals in the area of the water tanks; looking at all traffic issues; what issues have come to light to allow 40^{th} Street West to go through; timing of the City's share of the improvements.

APPEAL OF CUP NO. 05-15 AND TTM NO. 061555 PH 1. (continued) The Public Works Director stated that staff reviewed the issue in detail and considered new development; maintaining safety in the area; change in elevation; schools that would be affected; additional traffic; widening of streets; appropriate to make the change now; increased visibility; project will be added to the CIP list.

On a motion by Council Member Jeffra and seconded by Vice Mayor Sileo, the City Council approved the appeal, in part, by requiring redesign of Tentative Tract Map No. 061555 to connect 40th Street West to Avenue M in accordance with the added conditions listed in Attachment "A", and retaining the conditions approved by the Planning Commission that do not conflict with these added conditions, by the following vote: 5-0-0-0; AYES: Jeffra, Smith, Visokey, Sileo, Hearns; NOES: None; ABSTAIN: None; ABSENT: None

John Griggs – strict regulations regarding taxi drivers; would like to continue to drive a taxi; consideration of specific restrictions in the ordinance regarding driving history.

Jason Smith – concerns regarding the placement of lighters in the school supply area of the store - Big Lots.

Lore Rodgers – announced that Constitutional Month was coming up; displayed documents that children can purchase from Washington D.C. regarding the constitution; requested old photographs of Stanley Kleiner and Walter Young signing the Constitution Proclamation in 1976; requested time in September to set up a display in City Hall for citizens to come by and look at all the documents.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Council Member Smith – inquired about the Gang/Crime Task Force and Council Member Jeffra stated that he and Council Member Smith would be co-chairing that Force.

Council Member Smith – discussed dangerous fireworks and proposed that staff and the City Attorney look into creating a section within the ordinance that addresses aiding and abetting when it comes to dangerous fireworks, similar to the laws surrounding street racing currently; and will give an additional tool to law enforcement to cite people who are breaking the law.

Vice Mayor Sileo – inquired as to how this section of the fireworks ordinance would work and the comparability to street racing. Shared his concern with the Council and the City Attorney as to how this would be enforced without citing innocent people.

The City Attorney stated that he has reviewed many ordinances regarding fireworks but has not seen any ordinances that address this issue. He will continue looking for information on this and shared his concerns as to how aiding and abetting are defined and who should be cited. There are several issues that will need to be resolved. He will look into the legalities regarding this issue.

Council Member Jeffra – stated that the main purpose is to keep the citizens as safe as possible. The City will be very busy over the next few months adopting and amending different ordinances. He suggested that the City Attorney look into the possibility of designated areas for fireworks, possibly as something to fall back on.

Mayor Hearns – stated that a merchant in the area of Avenue I had a break-in and would like to see the City come together with the merchants of the City to discuss possible solutions.
