SECTION 8 NB 1.

Section 8 – Assistant City Manager, Al Holliman and Housing Director, Elizabeth Brubaker

The Housing Director stated there was a problem with Section 8 Housing moving from City of Los Angeles to Lancaster. City and County examined the Section 8 program in order to correct the problem, and will continue to meet.

Norm Hickling, Los Angeles County, stated the county has a good handle on the situation and problems can be handled in a timely manner.

The City Manager – the City will be addressing enforcement and will follow through with reports to City Council and Supervisor Antonovich.

PAROLE **NB 2.**

Parole – Assistant City Manager, Mark Bozigian

The Assistant City Manager stated we've made significant improvements to be more aggressive with parolees. Parolees should have ties to the community and there should be a restriction on transfer of parolees to this area. There should also be additional monitoring of high risk sex offenders, working in conjunction will be the City, Los Angeles County Sheriff Department, George and Sharon Runner and California Department of Correction.

Capt Carl Deeley, stated parole sweeps have improved the situation.

A County representative stated that they have a program that focuses on adult and youth probation.

JUDICIAL SPACE

NB 3.

Judicial Space – Additional Courtrooms – City Manager, Bob LaSala

The City Manager stated we face a challenge because of our growth and there's a need for additional courtrooms. Felony cases have increased by 50% since 2002.

Supervisor Antonovich stated the county is aware of this, that the City of Lancaster has a legitimate need, but the state must also be involved.

Capt Carl Deeley stated with increased arrests from LANCAP & TOPS, the need for additional courtrooms will increase.
